What is the CORE App Dashboard?

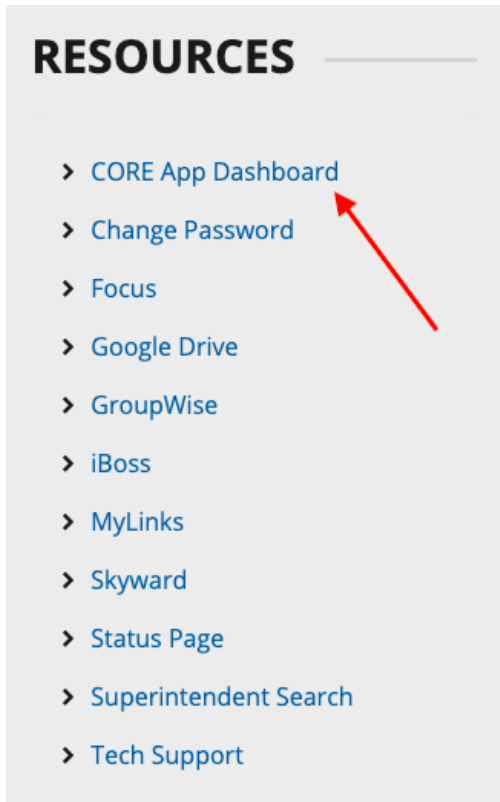
The CORE App Dashboard is what we call our student hub. It is a central place containing buttons and links to all student materials.

- Destiny**: This will allow you to access the library's card catalog and search for books.
- i-Ready**: This is a program students are using to help with math and reading. Home use is not recommended.
- Lang Arts**: This will take you to Connect Ed/Reading Wonders. This is where you will find a copy of your child's reading and language arts book.
- Math K-5**: This will take you to Envision Math. This is where you will find your child's math book.
- Music**: This is where you will find music resources.
- Schoolnet**: Schoolnet is a resource often used for testing and data collection. Some teachers may assign tests using schoolnet.
- Social Studies**: This is where you can find everything relating to AR (Accelerated Reading).
- Star 360**: This will take you to Studies Weekley. This is where you will find all Social Studies material.
- Student Rights and Responsibilities Handbook**: A digital copy of the Student Rights and Responsibilities Handbook can be found here.

How Can My Child Access The CORE?

There is a link on the main page of the district website located along the left side of the page. Students can click the link and then login with their username (Student ID number) and his or her password (six digit birthdate).
