## Choosing Classes: Example of IGETC-CSU/Cal-GETC GE Completion

Completing IGETC-CSU/Cal-GETC GE means you have completed your lower division general education requirements for both the University of California (UC) and California State University (CSU) systems.

**Following this suggested sequence is one way you could complete your lower division general education** for a degree while in high school (this does require summer school each year to complete). You can also read the complete general education patterns for [UCs/CSUs](#) to learn about completion requirements and see additional courses that can be completed to fulfill these requirements. \* indicates there is prerequisite coursework that must be completed with a "C" or higher to be eligible for enrollment

## IGETC-CSU/Cal-GETC GE PATHWAY BY GRADE LEVEL FOR GE COMPLETION WHILE IN HIGH SCHOOL

### 9th Grade

- COUN 53 College and Life Management - earns elective units only; strongly recommend course as a college skills foundation
- SPAN 1 Beginning Spanish or SPAN 2NS\* Preparatory Spanish for Native Speakers, ASL 1 Beginning American Sign Language, or other beginning foreign language course (other foreign languages available) - fulfills

Language Other than English requirement for UC's (Span 2NS fulfills Area 3B)

- ART 2 Art Appreciation, or TA 30 Theater Appreciation, or MUS 12 Music Appreciation, or MUS 17 History of Rock - fulfills GE Area 3A Arts

## 10th Grade

- \*SPAN 2 High-Beginning Spanish/\*SPAN 3NS Intermediate Spanish for Native Speakers, \*ASL 2 High-Beginning American Sign Language, or other second semester, high-beginning foreign language course - fulfills GE Area 3B Humanities
- BIOL 3 Introduction to Life Science or BIOL 14 (either your life science or your physical science must have a lab) - fulfills GE Area 5B Biological Sciences
- ASTRO 10 Basic Astronomy, GEOL 1 Physical Geology, or PHYSC 11 Introductory Physical Science (either your life science or your physical science must have a lab) - fulfills GE Area 5A Physical Sciences

## 11th Grade

- COMM 1 Introduction to Public Speaking, COMM 4 Persuasion, or COMM 8 Group Communication - fulfills GE Area 1C Oral Communication (approved for IGETC-CSU; not yet approved for CalGETC)
- AFRAM 1 Introduction to African American Studies, AMIND 31 American Indian Culture, ASAMER 15 Introduction to Asian American Studies, CLS 11 Introduction to Chicano-Latino Studies, or ETHNST 10, Introduction to Ethnic Studies - fulfills GE Area 7 Ethnic Studies
- \*ENGL 1A, Reading and Composition - fulfills GE Area 1A English Composition
- HIST 11 History of the US to 1877 or HIST 12 History of the US Since 1877 - fulfills GE Area 4 Social and Behavioral Sciences and CSU graduation requirement

## 12th Grade

- \*MATH 3A College Algebra, \*Math 10A Structure and Concepts in Math 1, \*Math 11 Elementary Statistics, or other math as appropriate\* (which math you take depends on your college major after high school and highest level of math completed in high school. You could take math earlier if you meet prerequisites. Talk to HSE counselor if you have questions) - fulfills GE Area 2 Mathematical Concepts
- \*ENGL 3 Critical Reading and Writing, or PHIL 2\* Critical Reasoning and Analytic Writing - fulfills GE Area 1B Critical Thinking
- POLSCI 2 American Government - fulfills GE Area 4 Social and Behavioral Sciences and CSU graduation requirement

**If you complete the GE pattern by the end of your Senior year, it is strongly encouraged that you complete the GE Certification form. GE Certification means the CSU or UC will accept the courses to meet the GE areas**

### **Choosing Classes: Pre-Approved IGETC/Cal-GETC GE Courses by Grade Level**

Here is our list of the most pre-approved courses to complete GE with our guidance for the earliest students should attempt the class based on course rigor and student success.

All classes must be passed with a "C" or higher.

**\*Requires completion of prerequisite course(s) with a "C" or higher to be eligible**

**NOTE:** Pols 2 and Hist 11/12 are CSU graduation requirements
