The Dashavatara are the ten primary avatars of Vishnu, a principal Hindu god. Vishnu is said to descend in the form of an avatar to restore cosmic order. The word Dashavatara derives from, meaning "ten", and, roughly equivalent to "incarnation".

The painting is done in Kalamkari style, which is an ancient art form from Andhra Pradesh in India. This style flourished in temples centered around creating unique religious figures, temple hangings, and scenes taken from the Hindu epics (e.g. Ramayana, Mahabharata and Purana).
