Roseville Community Scholarship 2025

<u>Create a google folder</u> (with your personal email; <u>NOT</u> school email) for documents you may want after high school - examples of documents you may want are your:

- Letter(s) of recommendation
- Resume
- Personal Essays (narrative essays from 11th grade, reflective writing you have done about yourself in other courses)
- Current transcript

Why should you do this? - If you are applying to colleges or scholarships now or in the future it will be great to have these documents in 1 place. If you are going straight into the workforce a resume and letters of recommendation are helpful documents to have prepared for your application.

What if I don't have a resume?

- 1. Open a Google Doc
- 2. Watch this resume video

What if I don't have letters of recommendation?

- 1. If you need a recommendation letter, consider a teacher/coach/staff member that knows you well. Request a letter from that person
- 2. If you don't think you'll need a letter, take time to create a <u>reference</u> list, this will be useful to you when applying for employment.

How do I download a transcript?

- 1. Log into Synergy/StudentVue through a web browser.
- 2. Go to Course History (the book icon).
- 3. Tap the blue Unofficial Transcript button, this will generate a PDF of your transcript.

What do I do next?

- 1. Check below for the scholarship's main objective so you can get an idea of what scholarships to apply for. These scholarships range from around \$250 to \$3000!
- Once you have gone through the list below, access the 'One Application' <u>HERE</u> and start applying! <u>ALL SCHOLARSHIPS ARE</u> <u>DUE SATURDAY, MARCH 15th @ 11:59PM!</u>
- 3. Some of the scholarships require a letter of recommendation. The ones with a star (*) asterisk next to the title does require a letter of recommendation. If you are applying to multiple scholarships that require it, have two to three people (at least one should be from a RAHS staff) write a letter for you and have them send it directly to Nyesha Brown at nyesha.brown@isd623.org.
- 4. Then head back to google folder to access the 'More Scholarships' google doc and apply to more scholarships! Here are the objectives:
 - a. American Legion: Based on achievements in athletics, arts and service to the community along with academic performance and consideration of other final awards received.
 - b. Class of 1964: Must be planning on becoming an educator or paraprofessional.
 - c. Community Band: Must be a band student & can attend their Spring Concert at RAHS on Sunday, April 13th at 3pm.
 - d. Key Club: Been an active Key Club member having contributed at least 25 hours of service during your years in Key Club.
 - e. *Kyle Satrom Memorial: Has overcome undue hardship, such as English as a second language, unusual family circumstances, medical problems and/or a disability.
 - f. League of Women Voters: (NOT subjected to students who only identify as female!) Meet one or more of the following criteria: has set and achieved a

personal goal, has life experiences that demonstrate self determination and or overcoming of challenges, assists non-English-speaking family, friends or members of their community to participate in their community, participates in school, religious or community group to promote cultural, environmental, educational or political engagement.

- g. *Lions Club: You MUST live either in Falcon Heights or Lauderdale.
- *Marsha Smith Memorial: a passion for the arts and the production of high quality work. (Letter of Rec from someone who can speak to your work in drama)
- Nick Tilleson Memorial: Desire and passion to enter the mental health field.
- Optimist Club: Volunteer experience from 9th to current year (at least 50 hours).
- Peter Konstantinides Memorial: Plan to attend college with an emphasis on fine arts
- I. PTA: At least a 2.5 or better GPA
- m. *RAREA: Plan to go into teaching
- n. Robert J. Dahlin Memorial: Should be decisive and hardworking with a clear vision of their future educational plans at a vocational, 2-year or 4-year college or university.
- Tusler Summit: Students that are going into professions serving the greater good of their community. Examples: education, medical, counseling, social work, etc
