- Victim - Rodney Wallace (32 years old)
- Suspect - Ronnie Wallace (30 years old)
- Details - The victim, Rodney Lydell Wallace, was discovered wounded in the street after being stabbed in the abdomen. He died the following morning. Police arrested 30-year-old Ronnie Schondell Wallace in April, but charges against him were dropped months later. Despite the similar names, Rodney and Ronnie are not related - however, Ronnie was a relative of Rodney's girlfriend. Rodney had been drinking alcohol inside the home with his girlfriend that night when they got into an altercation. Rodney got angry at his girlfriend, and the woman started demanding that Rodney leave her house, which he refused. Afterwards the girlfriend called her relative Ronnie for help, asking him to come over and get Rodney out of the house. According to the girlfriend, she noticed that both men were armed with knives shortly after Ronnie arrived, and she claimed to have locked herself in her bedroom as the two men confronted each other. When she came back out of her room, the house was empty and Rodney was laying in the street fatally wounded. One knife was found in Rodney's pants, and a second knife was found lying on top a trashcan outside a nearby house. The girlfriend told police that Rodney had previously threatened her with a knife. Despite there being a viable suspect, the murder may have gone unsolved due to how the detectives on this case handled it. Ronnie allegedly admitted the murder to somebody else, telling them he "had to" stab Rodney. Rodney Wallace's homicide wasn't even reported to news outlets until 2 months after it had happened.

Court Outcome: Charges were dropped - homicide remains unsolved.
