

LESSON TITLE

Sure Foundation: Building Our Lives Upon the Rock of Christ

UNIT 1 - Heavenly Authority

GRADES Preschool – Kindergarten

HOLY BIBLE

1 Corinthians 3:11, "For other foundation can no man lay than that is laid, which is Jesus Christ."

BOOK OF MORMON

Helaman 5:12, "...It is upon the rock of our Redeemer, who is Christ, the Son of God, that ye must build your foundation ...which is a sure foundation, a foundation whereon if men build they cannot fall."

OBJECTIVES

The student will be able to:

- Consider how to build a life upon Jesus.
- Consider that Jesus has great love for all people, John 15:13.

ESSENTIAL QUESTIONS

- Why is Jesus our friend?
- How do you know that Jesus loves you?

MATERIALS

Holy Bible(KJV) and The Book of Mormon

Video: pertaining to building on the Rock, e.g. <u>The Wise Man Built His House Upon The Rock</u> **Object Lesson:** 1 – small smooth rock per student. One 3" smooth stone, double stick tape, a small plastic house (such as from the Monopoly game), and a clear plastic food container about 7" square.

Picture: a building on a mountain/cliff (Google search. e.g. Holy Cross Church, Sedona, Az.), optional

Task: 1 - sheet of white paper/ child and colored pencils, Option: Select coloring page of Jesus, e.g. "Jesus Loves Little Children."

Permanent marker

PROCEDURE

Motivation/Introduction (5-7 minutes)

Prior to class: Write - JESUS on the board.

In class:

- 1. Point and cue students to say aloud the letters in Jesus's name.
- 2. Point and cue students to make the sound for each letter in Jesus's name
- 3. Cue students to say, "Jesus."

Object Lesson:

- 1. Hand each student a small rock and tell them to describe its properties, e.g. strong, hard, solid....
- 2. Place a piece of double stick tape or a tape doughnut on the bottom of a toy house and attach it to the smooth rock.
- 3. Tell students to observe. Put the rock inside the clear plastic container and shake the container, making the rockslide back and forth. Compare this to a storm, e.g. wind blowing, rain coming down. The house should remain intact on the rock.
- **4.** Explain that the house on the rock did not fall because it was firmly attached to the rock.
- Explain: Jesus is the rock and we are the house.We must be firmly attached to Jesus to protect us from storms of life.
- **6. Video:** Show a related video, e.g. The Wise Man Built His House Upon The Rock.

Goals: Consider how to build a life upon Jesus. Consider that Jesus has great love for all people.

Lesson Development (15-20 minutes)

- 1. Describe how Jesus is a Rock and explain how to build a life upon Him, Luke 6:47,48 ("Come", "Hear", and "Do"). (For guidance see Teacher's Supplement below.)
- 2. **Song:** Teach a song (Lyrics and video links in Teacher's Supplement.)
- 3. Discuss Essential Questions (Page 1).
- 4. **Task:** Students draw a picture depicting how Jesus loves them. Option: Give students a page to color.
- 5. **Task:** Write JESUS on students' rocks with a marker, and tell them to keep building their lives upon Jesus.
- 6. **Task:** Play "Follow the Leader" to reinforce concepts of listening and doing, time permitting.

Teacher's Supplement

Describe how Jesus is a Rock and Explain How to build upon Him.

1. Q: What happens to the rock when you squeeze it? What happens when you pull on it? How strong is a rock? Can you describe how the rock feels?

Rocks are hard and last a very long time. Rocks are strong. They can support heavy things.

- Show a picture of a building on a mountain and help students to understand that the building is being supported/ held up by the mountain.
- 2. Do you know why Jesus is like a rock?
 - a. Jesus came to earth to teach God's way to live (Solid).
 - b. Jesus died on the cross and came back to life to save all people (Powerful), so we can go to heaven to live with Him.
 - c. Jesus did all this because He loves people and cares for us (Support).
- People will be saved/go to heaven (a happy place) when they come to Jesus, hear Jesus, and do what Jesus says...
 - a. We come to Jesus by believing that He is God's Son. Do you believe that Jesus is God's Son?
 b. We hear Jesus by learning what Jesus says. Do you listen to lessons about Jesus? Do you learn about keeping God's commandments?
 - **c.** We can **do** what Jesus said by:
 - Loving God. Loving Jesus. Loving people.
 - Praying to God in heaven.
 - Praising God and Jesus in song.

By doing these things, we are building our lives on Jesus – our Rock!
