# Ask for better products that are more renewable, reusable, less hazardous, and use less energy

As a Federal site, we have Federal requirements to purchase environmentally-friendly products, which contain recycled content or biobased materials, contain safer chemicals, use less energy or water, or can be recycled or composted eventually.

## What can you do?

- In <u>eBuy</u>, purchase products from the Sustainability Package, found in the bottom right corner of the new eBuy homepage.
- Look for and ask for products that are environmentally friendly and have eco-labels (see the table below).
