

## **Athletic Eligibility and Off Campus Dual Enrollment**

(Excerpt pulled from the SCPPS District Athletic Documents  
as stated via LHSAA)

### Eligibility

1. Promotion from the 8th grade into the 9th grade for the first time shall fulfill the scholastic requirements.
2. To be eligible for the first semester of the school year, a student shall have earned at least 6 credits from the previous academic-year (fall, spring and summer), which shall be listed on the student's transcript and shall have earned at least a 1.5 average when considering all "graded" subjects.
3. To be eligible for the second semester of the school year, a student shall pass at least 6 subjects from the first semester. In determining eligibility at the end of the first semester of the school year for blocked classes, a subject's Carnegie unit value shall be multiplied by two when calculating the number of subjects a student passed; therefore, a Hahnville student must earn a minimum of 3 Carnegie units.

**4. Students who take dual enrollment courses must have those courses posted on their high school transcripts in order to be used to determine athletic eligibility.**

**5. Seniors who have accumulated 20 or more credits must take the number of courses which will allow them to earn 2 credits per semester. None of the courses taken shall be subjects/credits that the student had previously taken and passed. These courses may include dual enrollment college courses that have been recognized by the LDOE and/or the Louisiana Board of Regents. Under the 4x4 block system, a senior must be enrolled in a minimum of courses which will earn him/her 2 credits per semester in order to be eligible to compete.**

6. A senior who has earned 20 units must earn a minimum of 4 half credits or a total of 2 credits at the end of the first semester. Seniors will not be penalized for taking more than the minimum number of courses that they need to meet this requirement. In order to maintain eligibility in the second semester, seniors must be enrolled in enough courses which will earn them at least 4 half credits or a total of 2 credits.

**NOTE: HHS requires underclassmen to be enrolled in and attempt 4 Carnegie unit courses per semester.**
