Taking Action: What can we start doing now to center community members?	
What are you doing now?	What will you do tomorrow?
	<i>Let people bring their cats/dogs (wishful thinking)</i>
	<i>Pare down the total amount of information. Putting these best practices into action requires taking more time to teach and connect with learners. It's better to learn something than forget everything!</i>
	<i>Start meetings with encouragement for people to honor their needs during the meeting</i>
