ACT - American College Testing

ACT - March

The Statewide ACT will be offered to the entire junior class in **March 2026**, beginning promptly at **8:15 am** at **Emery High School**. Registration is not required and the test will be given free of charge. Cell phones are not permitted on Testing Day and photo IDs are required for admission. Students must have **#2 pencils** (**not mechanical**) and a calculator. Calculators may be checked out from their Math teacher if they are available. Have your student talk to their teacher about a calculator BEFORE testing day.

**It is recommended that you take the ACT more than once before your Senior year.

**You will use your highest ACT Composite score to apply for academic scholarships in October 2022.

**Your senior CE course placements (Math 1050-22, STATS 1040-20, English 1010-18) will be based on your Math and English scores AND your GPA.

ACT Benchmarks: Math 22 Science 23 English 18 Reading 22 Composite 22

ACT Testing Dates (Students should take the ACT no later than October of the senior year to meet early deadlines)

Be sure to check the admission requirements for all of the colleges you are interested in attending to verify their testing specifications.

Please visit act.org to register and pay for a test. The ACT is widely accepted in Utah.

Original Credit and Credit Recovery Options

Original Credit

If you are interested in taking a class that is not available at Emery High School you may schedule a class through an online school, signup for a class available through Edgenuity at EHS, or you may take a class from BYU Independent Study. Please talk to your counselor for options.

Credit Recovery

Failed credit must be remediated as soon as possible in any of the following ways:

Students who have >50% completed at the end of a term may ask their teacher for a remediation packet. This packet should be completed and returned to the teacher for a passing grade. This option is only possible for the immediate failed term.

Students who do not remediate with their teacher will be enrolled in Edgenuity for credit recovery. This tool is for Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies. Edgenuity is held during school.

Students who are not successful with teacher remediation or Edgenuity credit recovery will need to enroll in an online school through Utah Public Education Online: **seats.schools.utah.gov.**

What Classes should I take my Senior Year?

Use your time as a senior wisely. Fill your schedule with classes that will prepare you for college, Trade schools, career, scholarships, or other opportunities. You must register for the FULL YEAR!

Select remaining required class for graduation FIRST. Use your credit evaluation to learn what credits you still need.

CE - Concurrent Enrollment

A# - USU

Badger# - Snow College

Concurrent Enrollment is the ability to earn BOTH College credit and High School credit at the same time!

Please note that these are COLLEGE LEVEL classes! You must be prepared for the rigor of college to be successful in CE classes.

Apply for an A# and pay the one time \$50 fee as soon as you are scheduled for a USU class.

Apply for a Badger# and pay the one time \$30 fee as soon as you are schedule for Snow classes

Once you receive your A# and/or Badger# use it to open your account and select a password. YOU MUST REMEMBER THESE NUMBERS AND PASSWORDS! You will use them often!

CE classes are first come, first served.

CE French 1010 & 2010 must be enrolled with a Badger# before April 2023 for fall 2023 classes. Please see Lance Whitesel to enroll in French.

USU CE class enrollment will be around the end of July 2023. Please watch your email and parent links for specific date and time. You MUST have your A# BEFORE this date. It takes 3-5 days to receive your A# after you apply for it.

Do Your Post-Secondary Education Research

As you think about your plans after high school graduation, ask yourself the following questions:

Do I want to continue with education?

Do I want to go straight to work and do on-the-job training?

Can I handle another 2-4 years of traditional school or would I rather go the Trade/Vocational education route?

Do I want to join the Military?

Do I want to defer my education for a couple of years?

Research Your Options

Explore college, trade/vocational, apprentice program websites (admissions policies, scholarships, degree programs).

Go on a campus tour to get a feel for the campus, the school, and their programs.

EHS allows 2 extra absence days for college tours.

Prepare for College & Scholarship Applications

Get involved at school and in your community to boost your appeal. Begin a list of activities you have been involved in (grades 9-12) so college admissions and scholarship boards will know more about you and want to choose you.

Rigor of High School Courses (Honors, AP, CE classes)

Extracurricular Activities (Groups, Clubs, Sports, Music, Theater, etc., both in-and-out of school)

Community Service and Volunteer Work (This includes religious service work)

Internships, Employment, and Work Experience

Certificates and Special Skills

Awards and Recognitions

Leadership Positions and Responsibilities

GPA and ACT Scores

Check individual schools for their test policy regarding admissions and scholarships

Scholarship Prep 101

To be ready for scholarship applications you should begin the following tasks as soon as possible. Don't wait!

Essay: Well written with no grammatical errors (polished). Ask your Language Arts teacher (or someone else that is qualified) read through it and help with any needed corrections.

Education and Career Goals

Achievements in academics, school activities, and school/community/religious volunteer service

Be ready to tweak your essay if the scholarship requires focus on a specific requirement.

Local Scholarships \$\$\$\$\$\$\$

Information and most local scholarship applications can be found on ehs.emeryschools.org/Counseling. There are also Local Scholarship bulletin boards with applications already printed out.

Please pay attention to due dates, individual scholarship instructions, and where the competed scholarship should be turned in.

As a rule, don't expect to be awarded a scholarship you didn't apply for!

Opportunity Scholarship (formally Regents' Scholarship)

The Opportunity Scholarship is an achievement-based scholarship. Awards are determined based on available funding and the number of qualified applicants. It can be used toward the cost of tuition and fees after other state aid is applied. The scholarship is only available to use within the state of Utah.

Requirements:

Complete 1 Advance Placement (AP) or Concurrent Enrollment (CE) course in each of the core areas: Math, Science, Language Arts

Have a 3.3 or higher cumulative GPA

Complete the FAFSA Application

Sterling Scholar Scholarship

A Sterling Scholar is a high school senior who is publicly recognized and awarded for the pursuit of excellence in scholarship, leadership and citizenship in the State of Utah.

A potential Sterling Scholar presents an all-encompassing portfolio on their work in a specific category and is interviewed by judges in the category's field.

Students must apply in the spring of their junior year.

Each college and university offers specific scholarships for Sterling Scholar winners and runners-up at the region competition. In addition, winners and runners-up will receive a second scholarship from the Southeastern Utah Sterling Scholar Board.

Winners receive a \$2,500 scholarship. Runners-up will receive a \$1000 scholarship.
