ELIGIBILITY

26. Representation Rule:

Minimum Number of Contests To be eligible for sectional, intersectional or state competition, a team must have completed in **six (6)** school scheduled contests which occurred on **six (6)** different dates during the season.

Team Sports: An individual is eligible for the team if he/she has been an eligible participant on a team in that sport in that school for a minimum of **six (6)** scheduled contests during the regular season.

ENTERING THE SECTIONAL TOURNAMENT

- 1. The following actions are the responsibility of the school/coach and need to be taken prior to the Seeding meeting. A link and reminders to complete these forms will go out through BOCES to your AD's:
 - a. Officials Ratings
 - b. Non-Preferred Officials (submitted via Google Survey)
- 2. Schools must keep their schedule and game scores up-to-date on the Section One rSchoolToday platform. Please check with your Athletic Director if you are not familiar with the process for submitting scores.
- 3. Both schools need to enter the results, as this is a way of confirming the result of the game.

Team records and season results will be pulled by the Section One office on or around the last day to play and be considered the official record for the school. It is extremely important that the schedule and scores be accurate because you will be attesting to its accuracy for the purpose of seeding. This process has replaced the Scoreboard system that was used in the past.

NOTE: All scores to date must be entered into rSchool no later than **12:00pm**, **Sunday May 18th**. Schools are required to provide the sports chair(s) with the scores and results from games held after the submission of rSchool results via email.



2025 TOURNAMENT INFORMATION

1. **SEEDING & QUALIFYING**

a. Tournament seeding will be determined by the Seeding Committee using the approved **Section One Tournament Qualifying & Seeding Standard** which can be found on the Section One website.

2. GIRLS LACROSSE TOURNAMENT

a. The winning coach of each game is to e-mail results to the Chairperson as soon as possible.

3. GENERAL SECTIONAL PROTEST PROCEDURES

Any coach lodging a protest will immediately notify the AD/Site Coordinator of the contest. The term <u>immediately</u> is clarified to mean, "Before the ball becomes alive following the dead ball which the protested decision was made."

For all sectional games, there will be a three-person Protest Committee composed of the AD/Site Coordinator, another official (the timekeeper), and a third designated person. Each coach should know which person the AD/Site Coordinator is before the game.

- a. The protesting coach will get the attention of the officials and write the time of the protest in the book at the first dead ball situation.
- b. The AD/Site Coordinator, opposing coach, and officials on the court shall be notified.
- c. The three-person Committee will declare the protest on the spot, and the AD/Site Supervisor will notify all concerned of the decision.
- d. Games proceed to a conclusion. One team must win.

4. **SUSPENDED GAME** (Rule 4-4)

Article I. Once play begins the officials shall have the authority to interrupt or suspend the game due to dangerous weather or field conditions. The officials' decision is final. A game is considered legal and complete if 75% of playing time has elapsed. An interrupted game continued on the same day shall be restarted from its point of interruption.

Article II. If a suspended game (one in which less than 75% of playing time has elapsed) is replayed on another day, it must be played from the point of interruption. A suspended game may be terminated and considered complete by a mutual agreement of the opposing coaches. The score at the point of termination will be the official score of the game.

Article III. All stats from the suspended game (goals, team cards, etc.) should carry over from one part of the game to another even if it is played on a separate day. Cards should be recorded in the official book.

5. **OVERTIME PROCEDURES** (Rule 4-6)

When the score is tied at the end of regular playing time and overtime is to be played, both teams will have a five-minute rest and toss a coin (visiting captain calls) for choice of ends. The alternate possession shall continue from regulation. The game will be restarted by a center draw. The winner will be decided by "sudden victory". The team scoring the first goal wins the game. Each overtime period shall be two three-minute halves. The clock stops on official time-outs or fouls in the critical scoring area. After the first half of the overtime period, teams shall change ends with no delay for coaching. The game will be restarted by a center draw. If the teams are still tied after six minutes have elapsed, the teams will have a three-minute rest and change ends. Substitutions may occur at this time. Play will continue with "sudden victory" until a winning goal is scored.
