UNGA and UNSC resolutions calling for sanctions and embargoes

The goal of this research project is to compile a comprehensive record of key United Nations resolutions, including those from the General Assembly and the Security Council, concerning embargoes and sanctions imposed on states that violate international legal norms. The document provides an overview of the resolutions, including the resolution number, title, and key paragraphs that call for specific embargoes and sanctions to be imposed.

We aim to provide a comprehensive overview for states, civil society organisations, and researchers on how states, through the United Nations, have historically dealt with arms embargoes and sanctions in various contexts where fundamental violations of international law have occurred. This documentation is intended to serve as a reference in addressing the serious violations by the Israeli occupation, including its illegal presence in the occupied Palestinian territory, as determined by the International Court of Justice in its July 2024 <u>advisory opinion</u>. It sheds light on both previous international practices and the ongoing responsibility to end this unlawful situation, including through the imposition of arms embargoes and sanctions, as outlined in the <u>resolution</u> adopted by the United Nations General Assembly on 17 September 2024.

This is a working document and is regularly updated. While every effort has been made to include a comprehensive list of the relevant resolutions, there may be additional resolutions that are not covered here.
