Expenditure

➤ Youth participation action labs — Colleen O'Connor-Grant (PAC Chair): \$1000 to be taken from the Charrette/Covid fund that has over \$100,000. Youth participation in the charrette became a focus. 2 or 3 action labs. March-April. Helps kids have productive conversations and collaborate on ideas/ideas. The Charrette intends to highlight students, the proposal would be a workshop for teachers and families and children to attend. How will this be sustained in the long term? It needs to have all of the stakeholders involved, so that it feels more community-driven. Is there a way to share this information beforehand so that all families can digest information before having to vote at the PTA? Review and approval of a new fundraising proposal

➤ 50th anniversary Artist Patron Fundraiser –Marie Zinn (Fundraising Co-Chair): Every student will participate. Each child will keep their own works of art. There will be a book published of all of the art. \$2000 for creating and exhibiting the book. \$500 for mailings. \$300 for large prints for display.
