Put another way, when the poorest billionaire buys a \$100,000 Tesla he is exhibiting about the same purchasing power than when a median American household pays its \$8.99 basic monthly Netflix bill.

When that same billionaire buys a \$10 million mansion, it's the same as when a median American household pays the \$973 rent on their 2-bedroom urban apartment.
