Anti-Movie Trailer

The goal of this project is for students to create a movie trailer to produce an emotional reaction from the audience that is the opposite of the original film.

This project will be done individually. You will be creating an anti-movie trailer using footage from the movie of your choice. You will choose clips that can be sequenced and edited together to create an "opposite themed (genre)" movie trailer.

For example:

The Avengers made into a romantic comedy.

Despicable Me made into a serious drama.

Requirements

1. Previews must use appropriate footage - "approved" for all audiences.
2. Running time of 1 to 2 minutes.
3. The movie is your choice. The trailer must be for an opposite genre.
4. Planning sheets need to be approved prior to starting the work.
5. IT'S ALL ABOUT THE AUDIO!
 - a. Choose audio that has the tone you wish to create.
 - b. Edit to the beat of the film.
 - c. If you include dialogue, be sure that you duck the music, so we can hear it.
6. Title/Lead in for a trailer (ie. green screen introduction or 20th century fox).
7. Titles or voice overs if appropriate
 - a. All titles should be formatted appropriately, timed appropriately, and animated appropriately.
8. Appropriate Transitions
 - a. Trailers typically use a lot of transitions.
9. Appropriate Video Effects
 - a. Consider using video effects to create a new tone for the clip.
