
T/5 Joseph P. Gibson


son in Oshkosh, WI. On April 14, 1951, Joe married Rosemary P.

Joe used his carpentry skills to build a Swiss chalet home where they lived for seven years until the birth of their grandchildren called them back to Wisconsin. Joe then built another house on the Embarrass River with his own air strip. He and Rosemary made Caroline, WI, their home before finally settling back in Oshkosh.
