In addition to the Summer Reading Log and Summer Reading Assignment, be prepared at the start of the school year to explain what each book you read was about and what it meant to you. Below is a list of books that students in the 9th grade have loved in the past. Although there's a good chance you too will enjoy these books, you are not required to choose from this list.

Scholars who read at least **1,000 pages** this summer will be recognized with a CSM Summer Reading pin and certificate during an August Community Group.




Moxie by Jennifer Mathieu


Dear Martin by Nic Stone
