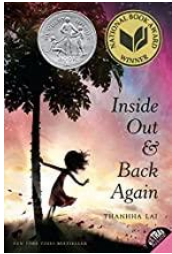
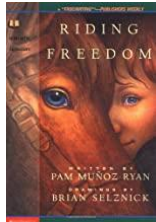
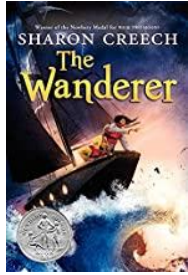
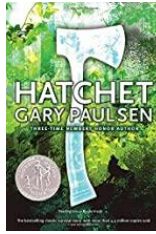
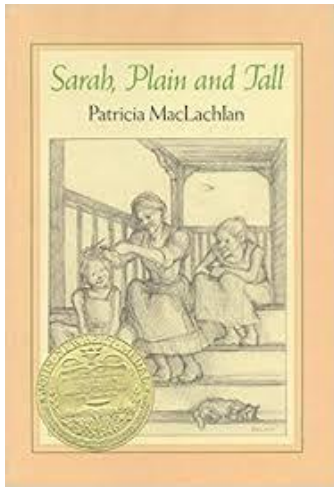
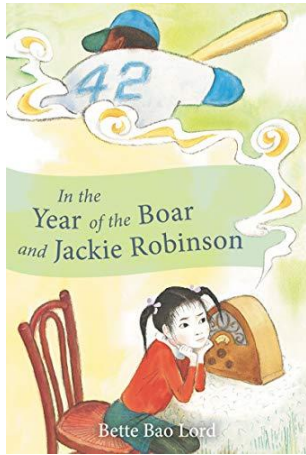


Book choices for Fall Book Circles

 800 <u>lexile</u>	Inspired by the author's own childhood experience of fleeing Vietnam as a refugee and immigrating to Alabama, this Newbery Honor Book and National Book Award winner told in verse is sure to capture young readers' hearts and open their eyes.	 720 <u>lexile</u>	The fictionalized adventures of Charlotte Parkhurst, a real heroine of the Wild West who lived her life as a boy.
 770 <u>lexile</u>	Until the day his father returns to their cabin in the Maine wilderness, 12-year-old Matt must try to survive on his own. During an attack by swarming bees, Matt is rescued by an Indian chief and his grandson. A Newbery Honor Book.	 830 <u>lexile</u>	Thirteen-year-old Sophie hears the sea calling, promising adventure and a chance for discovery as she sets sail for England with her three uncles and two cousins.
