Governance

When combined with our community conventions, and particularly those around decision-making, laying out our governance structure makes it clear what groups are responsible for making open and transparent decisions about specific topics or issues important to our community.

Our governance structure consists of core groups or teams that provide a distinct type of direction or guidance for individuals and project teams in our community:

Strategy + Operations Group	Overall direction and general guidance on non-technical topics or issues that affect everyone in the community.
