January 2021 Activity Report

In January, our activities included seeding vegetable crops in the farm, repairing the roof of two classrooms destroyed by cyclone Eloise, preparing material to build the 3 room education center at the Cyclone Idai resettlement camp, planting flowers at the center, and enrollment. Our program year follows the national school schedule, which begins in February.

□ Preschool (Escolinha Jardim de Deus):

We enrolled 198 kids between the ages of 3 to 5 years old, 96 at our center and 102 at the resettlement camp. We have more to enroll but we stopped because the government mandated a lockdown of 30 days. We began preparing the land to build the new education building!

☐ Literacy and Bibles Ministry:

We enrolled **165** women and men. Classes should reopen on March 19.

☐ Choir Group:

Per the government guidelines, we didn't meet but plan to continue as we are able.

☐ Pastor Ministry:

We enrolled 36 pastors in the community. We continue to study together, through home lessons.

☐ Farming Activities:

We seeded vegetables crops such as beans, cucumber, lettuce, beetroot, cabbage, kale, green peppers and carrots.

☐ Sewing Program (Vide e Vede):

Classes aren't meeting, but we are making face masks for the communities. 43 people enrolled.

☐ Sheep's Gate Church:


We praise God for wisdom and direction every day as the church is growing. With the pandemic we meet two days a week to pray together, on Wednesday and Sunday. We go out in the community to visit brothers and sisters, and we clean the church these days as well.

Please continue to pray for wisdom, provision and health for our church family, as we are facing hunger this season because of lack of food availability and the high cost of what is available.

☐ Animals

Here's what's happening with our animal collection:

- Ducks- we have 54 ducks and 3 ducks setting on 37 eggs.
- Chicken- we have 60 live chicks and six chickens are setting on 40 eggs.
- We lost about **89 turkey** eggs because of the cyclone, but **four** hens are laying and setting again.
- Pigs- We are awaiting our **two** pregnant sows to give birth. The rest are healthy.



We also provide spiritual care for people by doing regular home visits in the community to teach the Bible, to pray and to demonstrate love by meeting practical needs through whatever means we have available. We praise God for the opportunity to share His love in our community.

Finally, please keep in view and in prayer the ongoing needs of the communities in this rural area, which include: health care (the hospital is around 7km away), lack of permanent shelter after Cyclone Idai from 2019, insufficient Bible knowledge, education, malnutrition, lack of hygiene in general, clean water, Covid concerns and food poverty.

Our responsibility as a team is to work together to better watch and care for our people as **LIGHT FOR THE HUNGER PROJECT (LHP).**
