June 15th is the 40th anniversary of the landmark *Plyler v. Doe* Supreme Court decision asserting the Constitutional right of all children in the United States to receive a K-12 education, regardless of their immigration status. June 15th is ALSO the 10th anniversary of DACA<sup>1</sup>, the 2012 Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program that allowed certain people who came to the United States as children, if eligible, to receive temporary protection from deportation and obtain a work permit. DACA has improved the lives of almost a million people living in the United States since 2012.
