

KCIA SRCSP 6 month Review and Revision- June 2022

As KCIA approaches the 2022-23 school year, the school has reviewed the SRCSP plan with input and feedback from students, parents, school and district administrators, teachers, staff and Special Education staff to ensure continued safe operations to maintain the health and safety of students and staff. At this time no revisions are deemed necessary and KCIA will continue to implement the strategies and practices outlined below.

KCIA SRCSP 2022

As KCIA opens its doors for the 2022-23 school year, it will ensure continued safe operations to maintain the health and safety of students and staff. The mitigation and prevention strategies, outlined below, are guided by state, local and national health officials. All guidelines are subject to change as guidance and the data surrounding COVID-19 changes. These strategies will continue to be updated throughout the school year (no less than every six months), based upon new information and operational experiences.

Mitigation and prevention strategies for in-person learning:

1. Handwashing and respiratory etiquette
 - a. Consistent with the CDC
 - b. Taught and reinforced
 - c. Sanitizer, disinfectant, and paper towels provided
2. Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities
 - a. Consistent with the CDC
 - b. Increased cleaning for high-touch surfaces
3. Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine, in collaboration with the State, local, territorial, or Tribal health departments
 - a. Consistent with CDC
 - b. Contact tracing by LEA
 - c. Contact tracing by the local public health authority (LPHA)
4. Diagnostic and screening testing
 - a. Testing provided onsite and at LPHA
5. Efforts to provide vaccinations to educators, other staff, and students, if eligible
 - a. LEA sponsors vaccination events
 - b. LEA participates in vaccination events
 - c. Incentives provided for vaccination
6. Appropriate accommodations for children with disabilities with respect to the health and safety policies
 - a. Accommodations as necessary or as mandated by Individual Education Plan
7. Universal mask wearing for students and staff
8. Physical Distancing
 - a. Students will remain in cohort groups to the greatest extent possible
 - b. Meals are served in classrooms in small groups where possible
 - c. Hallway transitions structured to limit the number of students together during passing periods
 - d. Specials teachers will travel to provide instruction in classrooms where possible

Continuity of Services:

In the case of any interruptions to in-person instruction (including the need to close down a classroom or the entire school because of a community or school Covid-19 outbreak), our students and teachers might move to a split mode or a full distance learning mode. More information is outlined below in our AMI Plan, which will become active when necessary. During interruptions to in-person instruction, KCIA will continue to provide for the social, emotional, mental, and nutritional health needs of students and staff.

KCIA Alternative Methods of Instruction (AMI) Plan

Missouri law regarding school cancellations due to weather and other emergency situations has changed. As a result, when it becomes necessary to cancel in-building attendance, instruction will continue at home. KCIA will inform parents by robocall, FlyerConnect announcement, social media, and TV listing when in-building attendance is canceled and the AMI plan becomes active. On these days teachers will post class assignments for Kindergarten and First Grade students in SeeSaw by 9:00AM. Teachers will post class assignments for students in grades 2-8 in Google Classroom by 9:00AM. Students should login and complete assignments. KCIA teachers will provide feedback to your student throughout the day and/or upon his/her return to the classroom. If your family does not have access to the internet at home, your child's teacher will send a packet of work home to be completed. In order to be counted as present for attendance purposes on AMI days your child must login and complete assignments or return the completed packet to the teacher once school resumes. With this new plan weather days during the school year will not have to be made up in the Spring/Summer months.
