Pack 47 Information

What are Boy Scouts / Cub Scouts?

Scouting is an excellent way for boys and young men to learn valuable life skills, develop confidence and self-discipline, learn and apply survival skills, and contribute to society through various projects and activities. Scouts advance their rank by completing a range of achievements through adolescence, culminating with the prestigious rank of Eagle Scout.

Some packs are now accepting girls as members of the pack separately from the boys. While we encourage family camping and participation in pack activities, we do not currently have separate registration and dens for girls. All Scouts in Kindergarten through 4th grade are considered "Cub Scouts." In 5th grade, Cub Scouts transition to the "Boy Scouts." Cub Scouts meet in "packs," Boy Scouts meet in "troops."

"The mission of the Boy Scouts of America is to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Scout Law." - *Boy Scouts of America Mission Statement*

Tell me about Cub Scouting.

Each Cub Scout is a member of a "den." Scouts are divided into dens by grade: Lion Cubs (Kindergarten), Tiger Cubs (1st grade), Wolves (2nd grade), Bears (3rd grade), Webelos (4th /5th grade) and Arrow of Light (5th grade). Scouts attend den meetings to learn new things and have fun. Dens are led by a team of adult volunteer den leaders. Den leaders are usually parents of boys in the den. They make sure the boys complete the achievements necessary for their age group.

All dens combined make up a "pack." There are dozens of packs around the area and each one is independently coordinated. Each pack is hosted by an organization (a church, school, youth group, etc.). Our pack is Pack 47, and we are hosted by Central Baptist Church in downtown Newnan. The church also hosts the Boy Scout Troop 47.

Many packs, together with the troops, make up a "council." All packs within Coweta, Fayette, Butts, Henry, Lamar, Pike, Spalding, and Upson counties collectively make up the Flint River Council. There are nearly 300 councils with over 2.4 million scouts and 1 million adult volunteers across our country making up the Boy Scouts of America.

Tell me about our Pack.

Pack 47 was formed with busy families in mind. Many of our scouts are also involved in sports or other activities and we try to schedule our activities to promote a good balance. As a result, we tend to meet less frequently than other packs. In addition to working towards the vision of the Boy Scouts of America, our goal as a pack is for our scouts and families to **HAVE FUN!** Parents and siblings are encouraged to participate in camps and outings for a fun family experience.

Pack 47 Information (*continued*)

Tell me about our meetings.

Scouts will generally meet twice per month: once with their respective den and once with the entire pack. Meeting schedules are included in the welcome packet, although some meeting dates and/or times may change under certain circumstances.

Our Pack meets once per month to share news relevant to all dens and allow interaction between dens. Pack meetings usually follow a suggested theme and are a time for boys to be recognized for their accomplishments during the month, to perform skits and songs they've learned in den meetings, and to have fun with the entire family. The Pack meetings are held on the fourth Sunday of each month at 3 pm at the Central Baptist Church fellowship hall. There are two entrances, one facing Spring Street and one facing East Broad St.

Each den meets according to their respective schedule (see Den Meetings schedule section). Because we meet this infrequently, we encourage scouts to attend the Coweta District Cub Scout Day Camp during the summer at the Coweta County Fairgrounds. At this camp, your Cub Scout will complete many requirements for their achievements towards their badges for the upcoming year's Cub Scout program. This makes it possible to have one den meeting per month, making it easier for your Cub Scout to participate in scouting, sports, and other outside activities.

Tell me about Cub Scout Uniforms.

We expect every boy to be in uniform at all monthly Pack and Den meetings and/or other outside den activities. The uniform includes: Class A BSA blue shirt or Class B t-shirt (as advised). The Class A uniform also includes den neckerchief, slide, belt and hat. BSA-issued pants are not required; blue jeans, blue pants, and shorts are acceptable.

Do we participate in fundraising?

To avoid competing with fundraising activities for other extracurricular activities, our pack has traditionally opted for a fixed-price structure for our listed pack activities (details in the Dues section below). We do not track scout accounts at the pack level and fundraising participation is a scout/family decision.

For camps and other scouting activities, the Boy Scouts of America provides fundraising opportunities to help offset costs to scouts as needed. In addition to helping the scout, the fundraisers also help to support the operating costs of the Flint River Council camps and programs.

The most common fundraising options are Camp Cards and Popcorn Sales. Pack 47 does participate in Camp Card sales, but we have historically avoided Popcorn Sales based on feedback from parents. Please see the Cubmaster if you are interested in further fundraising information about popcorn sales.

With Camp Cards, participating stores around our area offer coupons or discounts when using a Camp Card. Scouts buy the cards for \$2.50/each and sell them for \$5/each. Scouts can use the \$2.50 profit per card to pay for camp, and there are incentives for selling different quantities. There is no limit to how many cards scouts can sell. This fundraiser is conducted in March.

Since our pack has opted to not promote popcorn sales, parents are encouraged to make a small donation to the Flint River Council. This is optional and not tracked at the pack level. The opportunity to commit to a donation is usually presented during the end-of-year Blue & Gold banquet.

I'm a single mom – can I participate?

Absolutely! We have many scouts with only one participating parent for various reasons. Fellow scouts and parents provide excellent support for those with no prior experience – moms and dads alike.

Campouts Schedules & Details

There are a minimum of three planned campouts each season. Additional camps may be available throughout the year based on attendance interest. Camping with Cub Scouts is very family friendly. Parents, grandparents, and siblings are invited to attend these memory-making events. Additional camp details will be sent to all parents ahead of the campout. Boy Scouts of America prohibits use of alcohol, tobacco, and drugs in the camping area. **Pets are prohibited as well.**

This is our first official campout as a pack and a great introduction to camping for those new to the experience. The campsite features a mix of woods and fields for locating tents and a fire pit for evening fun. There is also a pavilion with electricity, bathrooms, and running water.

The pack covers campsite fees. There is an annual festival at the adjacent nature center featuring cane-sugar production, blacksmithing, and more. The pack will hike to the festival from our campsite on Saturday morning to enjoy the events. Entry to the event is free of charge. The center accepts donations and has souvenirs available for sale. In previous years a BBQ lunch was offered for a donation. We will know more information as the time approaches.

 - d. No need for den numbers or other patches
