

They will also have an opportunity to dunk an administrator or even a teacher in the dunk tank that day. This event is used to raise funds to support various school activities and trips. - Athletic events are a function of school! General conduct, behavior, etc. must be in accordance with school and district policy!
- Parents/guardians must accompany their child and be readily available if needed (and not represent more than 2 other students). WAMS students without a parent/adult present will <u>not</u> be permitted entry.
- Students who receive any type of suspension are not permitted in athletic events on the day of the suspension or infraction.
- Disrespectful behavior, foul language, general misconduct, etc. that poorly represent the district and community will not be tolerated!
- These games are meant to be a fun family and community event to support our athletics teamsplease help us keep it that way!

Arrival and Dismissal!

Arrival and Dismissal will look slightly different this year as we continue to improve the effectiveness of having a large number of students enter and dismiss from the building daily. Changes always are made with student safety and effectiveness in mind.

Arrival

Arrival will look much the same as it did last school year. The late bell rings at 7:38, students are expected to be in the building and ready to be in class by that time. The doors open at 7:15 regardless of the weather. We ask that students not be dropped off much before that time if possible. 6th grade students will report to the cafeteria when entering, 7th-grade students will report to the gym when entering, and 8th-grade students will report to the auditorium when entering. Students will be able to report to the first period starting at 7:30. All students may eat breakfast! Bus Riders will walk over to WAMS from WASHS. Car Riders may be dropped off in the Summitview Parking lot and walk the back sidewalk to the WAMS rear entrance as in years past.

Dismissal

Dismissal is slightly different than last year, but for parents and guardians, there will appear to be little difference. WAMS will be doing a slightly staggered release for bus riders; 6th grade exiting first, then 7th, and finally 8th. This will allow for a smoother transition over to WASHS as well as allow additional teachers to be present to help escort and monitor students as they dismiss and load buses. Walkers and Car Riders will be dismissed at 2:28 and will all exit the front of the building. Like last year, car riders are picked up out front!

Outside Agencies

The District welcomes the help and advocacy of numerous outside agencies operating within Franklin County in supporting our students. Please note it is the sole responsibility of the individual or agency to submit clearances and other required paperwork to the District Central Administrative Office at Clayton Avenue PRIOR to the start date with a student in the building, and they must also be in possession of a photo ID or identification purposes to enter a school building. Person(s) without clearances and without ID will not be permitted inside of a school building.

Again, this is the sole responsibility of the individual person or agency.

IMPORTANT FOR ALL PARENTS/GUARDIANS:

Parents ~ if your child is tardy they are permitted to come into the building without a parent. However, if you are picking up your student you must come in the building to sign your child out. You must have a photo id to pick up your child.

If you need a grandparent, relative, or friend to pick up your child please specify on the note who will be picking up your child. A photo id must be shown in order to pick up any learner at WAMS.

Emergency Cards, Attendance Pads, and a few other forms were sent home with your learner on the first day.

Please complete the Emergency Card & COPPA form and return it with your student.

WASD Calendars are still being printed we will distribute

them as soon as they arrive.

When a student is absent or leaving early for an appointment parents should send in a note. Those notes are turned into the office first thing in the morning.

If you forget to send a note no need to worry ~ Just call the WAMS Office and let us know. We will have you write a note when you pick up your learner.

Excuses are due within 3 days of your learner returning to school. You may also email Mrs. Fleagle at mary fleagle@wasdpa.org with a note.

District Passwords

Passwords are important! Please see the bullets below for district requirements on student passwords. Also, please discuss the importance of NEVER sharing passwords, codes, combinations, personal information, etc. with anyone!

- Users will be asked to change their password every 60 days
- Users won't be able to use their previous 10 passwords
- Passwords must be at least 6 Characters
- Passwords can't contain any part of the user name
- Passwords must contain at least three of the following:
- Uppercase Letter
- Lowercase Letter
- Number
- Symbol

Airdrop - Turn it off!

"Air-drop" is a phone function where others can wirelessly upload pictures, videos, and digital content onto another person's phone or device. This is an amazing feature of phones and devices when family and friends are swapping pictures of a fun trip, good memories, or the latest grandbaby picture; however, depending on your setting, you could be opening your phone to strangers being able to "drop" inappropriate content on your phone. When the setting is set to "Everybody", anybody with an iPhone, cell phone service, and within 40 feet try to upload content to your phone - even if they don't have your number! When this occurs you will be prompted to "accept" the content. Please warn students to never accept content from people/accounts they don't know! Even better, users can change their settings to only accept "contacts" i.e. phone numbers we have saved, or off altogether.

Commication We Number What does communication look like at the Middle School and how do I get information?!

- Every day at WAMS all students receive information daily in a multitude of ways, the most common are:
 - Morning and afternoon announcements are made daily
 - The administration makes announcements daily at all lunches
 - Teacher announcements and Braves Block
 - TV Slides throughout the building and cafe with updated announcements daily!
 - As your student gets older and progresses towards WASHS and life, it is essential for them to be responsible for information!

Number 2: teachers and team leaders!

- Every team has a team leader who can act as a primary contact for all parents and guardians on a team
 - Please contact your team leader if you have general questions about team activities. rules, field trips, or anything else!
 - Specific questions about a classroom, grade, or assignment can be directed specifically to the classroom teacher.
 - You can always request a team meeting to speak with everyone!
 - All teams communicate in various ways, including the remind app, email, the portal, etc. Check with your team leader for specifics!

Number 3: the parent portal and Schoology

- The portal is a wonderful place to check for updated news about events and activities and grades in general. Contact the office for login information!
- Schoology is more specific information regarding grades, assignments, and team events. Contact your student's teacher for login information!
- I recommend checking both weekly!

Number 4: The Website

- Announcements and important information are made available frequently on the website! I recommend checking the website at least weekly! These announcements also go to the WAMS Facebook Page. Please note: Facebook is not monitored.
- The website also includes our WAMS Monthly Newsletter! Check it out for all the latest information!

Number 5: The Office

Keep Your Child On Track in Middle and High School: Pay Attention to Attendance

Even as children grow older and more independent, families play a key role in making sure students access learning opportunities and understand why attendance is so important for success in school and on the job. Families can also advocate for resources to help students learn if they cannot attend in-person.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Students should miss no more than 9 days of school each year to stay engaged, successful and on track to graduation.
- Frequent absences can be a sign that a student is losing interest in school, struggling with school work, dealing with a bully or facing some other difficulty.
- By 6th grade, absenteeism is one of three signs that a student may drop out of high school.
- By 9th grade, attendance is a better predictor of graduation rates than 8th grade test scores.
- Missing 10%, or 2 days a month, over the course of the school year, can affect a student's academic success.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

Make school attendance a priority

- · Talk about the importance of showing up to school every day.
- Help your teen maintain daily routines, such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.
- Try not to schedule dental and non-Covid-19 related medical appointments during the school day.
- Keep your student healthy, and if you are concerned about Covid-19, call your school for advice.
- If your teens must stay home because they are sick or in quarantine, make sure they have asked teachers for resources
 and materials to make up for the missed learning time in the classroom.

Help your teen stay engaged

- Find out if your children feel engaged by their classes, and feel safe from bullies and other threats.
- Make sure your teens are not missing class because of challenges with behavioral issues or school discipline policies. If any of these are problems, contact the school and work with them to find a solution.
- Monitor you teen's academic progress and seek help from teachers or tutors when necessary. Make sure teachers know how to contact you.
- Stay on top of your child's social contacts. Peer pressure can lead to skipping school, while students without many friends can feel isolated.
- Encourage your teen to join meaningful after-school activities, including sports and clubs.
- · Notice and support your students if they are showing signs of anxiety.

Communicate with the school

- · Know the school's attendance policy incentives and penalties.
- Check on your teen's attendance to be sure absences are not adding up.
- Seek help from school staff, other parents or community agencies if you need support.

The Waynesboro Area School District has a dress code that is enforced every day! If you have not had a chance to read the district Dress Code please do so <u>HERE!</u>


Students who are sent to the office for dress code will have the opportunity to change if they have alternative clothes, may choose from extra clothing items we have available in the nurse's office (all laundered after each use), or may call home for additional clothing items to be brought into school.

Bullying....

Bullying is **NOT tolerated** in the Middle School or in the District! If you suspect bullying in any way please alert school staff **immediately**! It is extremely important that students report bullying and other inappropriate interactions as quickly as possible. **We as school staff and officials will be unable to help or address the issue if we don't know it's happening!**

If cyber-bullying or bullying in general is occurring off of school grounds or after school hours my recommendation is to call the Boro Police, Washington Township Police, or PA State Police depending on where you live or where the incident occurred. *After calling the police please let school staff know about the incident so we can take proactive measures here in the building.* In case of cyberbullying, I also recommend taking screenshots, pictures, or videos of the incident on social media to give to the police.

Cell Phone Policy!

Cell Phones are <u>NOT</u> permitted to be used during the school day! Students are encouraged not to bring cell phones to school at all! If your students decide to bring a cell phone, it is advised to keep the phone off and put it away in their locker or book bag. If the student chooses to keep the phone on them, it must be off and not visible at all times! If the student is caught using their phone FOR ANY REASON during the school day the phone will be confiscated and consequences are issued. Please note: this includes calling because the student is sick! If a student is sick, they should go to the nurse immediately to receive treatment!

Students may then call from the nurse's office. Remember; **OFF** and **AWAY!**

Please note: this includes Airpods, earbuds, smartwatches, and other devices/technology! Airpods/earbuds are permitted at the teacher's discretion to connect only to the Chromebook for instructional purposes. Vaping - An ongoing nationwide problem for schools...

WAMS administration handles many incidents where a learner was found to be in possession of one an e-cigarette, also known as a vape; although I am sad to say that there were probably many more that the administration did not catch or were not aware of. The graphic below illustrates some of the different types of e-cigarettes on the



market.

According to the Breath, Pennsylvania website:

- Nicotine levels may be much higher in e-cigarettes than in cigarettes.
- E-cigarette cartridges contain many harmful ingredients, including heavy metals and chemicals linked to lung disease.
- E-cigarette devices can explode, causing burns and projectile injuries.

There definitely is a trend for students to engage in vaping while in the restrooms. We encourage learners to keep themselves out of such a situation and report it if seen. Learners found in such a situation are subject to their personal items being searched. Learners found in possession of vape or vape cartridges will receive a day of in-school suspension and a non-traffic citation from WASD Police. (Possession of e-cigarettes on school property by anyone is against the law in Pennsylvania.) Fines and court costs for the first offense are around \$150.

Some vapes, like #8, are compatible with cartridges that contain THC, one of the chemicals in marijuana. Vapes will be tested by WASD Police. Possession of a vape that tests positive for THC is a violation of WASD Policy 227 regarding controlled substances/paraphernalia. Learners will be suspended from school for 10 days, be required to attend an informal hearing before the disciplinary committee of the school board, and will likely face additional consequences (exclusion from WASD events, sports, activities, and educational reassignment for a period of time).

Bottom line: Please help us keep e-cigarettes out of our school by talking to your child about vaping and periodically checking their bookbag!!!

IMPORTANT Safety Info for Families

Several WASD Board policies reference the use of prescription medications and the use/possession of drugs or alcohol on school property.

- POLICY 210 Medications
 - All prescription and over-the-counter medications MUST be kept in the school nurse's office at all times unless medical documentation is on file for the learner to self carry. Common examples include inhalers and epipens. Please contact our school nurse, Mrs. Torey Kauffman (Torey Kauffman@wasdpa.org) with any questions.
- POLICY 222 Tobacco and Vaping Products

All tobacco products and vaping products are prohibited on school property and on school-sponsored events. Learners found to be in possession of tobacco and/or vaping products are subject to disciplinary consequences and referral for prosecution.

• POLICY 227 - Controlled Substances/Paraphernalia

Controlled substances, look-alike drugs, and paraphernalia are prohibited on school property and on school-sponsored events. "Violations of this policy may result in disciplinary action up to and including expulsion and referral for prosecution."

Please review these policies and talk to your child about the **importance of keeping these illegal substances out of our schools**.


