# Indicators of Well Being (Drawn from Ministry of the Future).

  to take fuller account of the well-being of a nation, only a part of which pertains to the
  health of the nation's economy, by incorporating environmental and social factors which
  are not measured by Gross Domestic Product (GDP). GPI has been suggested to
  replace, or supplement, GDP as a measure of economic growth.
- The Human Development Index The HDI was created to emphasize that people and
  their capabilities should be the ultimate criteria for assessing the development of a
  country, not economic growth alone. The HDI can also be used to question national
  policy choices, asking how two countries with the same level of GNI per capita can end
  up with different human development outcomes.

These are in no particular order. They include newspapers, blogs, non-governmental organizations, and think tanks. Note that on many of these publications, you will encounter a paywall after a few free articles.

What happens when you hit the paywall? Here are your options.

- 1) Use a different browser. Instead of chrome, switch to explorer. A new browser gives you a fresh set of articles.
- 2) Subscribe to the New York Time or the Post. Student subscriptions are fairly cheap. In the case of the Times, I think it is \$4 per month.

- 3) Search for the articles through the FGCU library. Here's how:
  - Go to FGCU library
  - Click databases.
  - In the search for databased type "ProQuest News"
  - Use advanced search in ProQuest News to find assigned articles. I find that if you enter author, title, publication and date range, you will find what you are looking for.
  - This is a little labor intensive, but it does teach you how to use the library databases.
