- 8. Summarize FDR's point in paragraphs 10-12. How does this relate to any of the ideas in an earlier paragraph?
- 9. What is the subject of paragraph 13 and what is he saying about it?
- 10. What proposal is he making in paragraphs 14-16? What kind of progression is he describing? What is he saying about presidential power?
- 11. Compare this speech to Abraham Lincoln's First Inaugural Address. What similarities do you see regarding the ideas expressed and the situations that they're in?
