



## **Using Seesaw for Learning @ Home**

The information below applies to any Hanover School Division student who was using Seesaw at school and has now moved to participating in remote learning partially or fully.

### **Seesaw Family App & Seesaw Class App**

There are 2 types of Seesaw apps. They are different yet connected.

**Seesaw Family** is for parents/guardians to use on their personal device to view all posts in their child's journal and see announcements from the teacher anytime.

**Seesaw Class** is what students use when at school AND when at home for remote learning. The Class app allows students to create items that they add to their student journal, to view lessons, whole class information, feedback from their teachers, and to complete special Seesaw Activities that are assigned by their teachers.

### **Compatible Devices for Seesaw Class**

Students can access Seesaw Class by going on the Class app OR using the web-based version at [app.seesaw.me](https://app.seesaw.me). It is available on iOS, Android, Chromebooks, and computers with Chrome/Firefox. A child can access all Seesaw features no matter the device or platform they are using.

### **How to Sign Into Seesaw Class at Home**

At home, students sign in either with their individualized Home Learning Code or use their HSD Google sign in. Teachers will let you know what sign in method your child should use from home.

### **Multiple Children Using Seesaw Class in the Same Home**

Each time a different child wants to use Seesaw, they need to Sign Out and the other child has to Sign In with their Home Learning Code or their HSD Google sign in. Unfortunately at this time there is no easier way to toggle between different children's accounts using the Class app.

Find some of your socks and try to see if you can make a pattern out of the socks in your drawer. Try AB, ABA, AAB, ABB and ABC patterns. Post photos of your thinking in Seesaw.	Count how many people are in your extended family. Use these questions to learn about your family: How is the youngest person in your family? Add the oldest one? Are there more boys or girls?
