Badgerlink	Wisconsin's Online Library  Many types of resources provided by the state libraries and available to Wisconsin residents.  E.g. Jo Wilder Capital Case - "Be the detective! Unravel the clues and think like a historian to find the real stories behind mysterious Wisconsin history artifacts."
Readers Theater	Set up an online meeting of same-age peers (cousins, friends, classmates) via FaceTime or Google Hangouts or Zoom. Pick a shared text from Readers Theatre. Distribute the text in advance and assign roles. Each participant reads their role. Students then discuss the text.  They could use "Content-free Discussion Questions" to guide a discussion of fiction or nonfiction texts.

The website lists the title of the script, followed by the number of roles. Example: Rumplestiltskin (8).
