The Justice Ministry of Essexia Makes the following regulations and reforms in the exercise of the powers conferred by decree of the Constitution.

Definitions:

An Act of Parliament shall be a Bill or piece of Legislation passed by the Parliament of Essexia through the correct and appropriate systems as set out by the Constitution of Essexia.

- 1. The Ministry of Justice (MoJ) and Ministry of Interior (MoI) shall cooperate to create the Legal Essexian Database (LED).**
 - a. Any Act of Parliament, Imperial Decree, or other legislative document that is not in the Legal Essexian Database will be considered not legally binding and thereby it is rendered null and void.
 - b. All Acts of Parliament, Imperial Decrees, and other legislative documents must be included within the database.
 - i. If there is no reasonable manner to retrieve a physical or digital copy of a statute, Imperial Decree, or other legal document in a reasonably complete form then the act will not be included within the database and thereby creates an exemption from this requirement.
 1. Grounds under which there is no reasonable manner to retrieve a piece of legislation, Imperial Decree, or other legislative document include but are not limited to;

- a. The non-existence of the document in a physical or digital form.
 - b. The inability to access the physical or digital form of the document.
 - i. Such as in the case that a digital form of a document that can only be accessed through an account(s) that is no longer accessible by any person currently related to the Essexian Government or legislature.
 2. Grounds under which a document is not considered to be reasonably complete for legal use include but are not limited to;
 - a. The irretrievable loss of any content from a piece of legislation.
 - b. The irretrievable loss of documentation regarding the legal passing of an item of legislation.
 - ii. It is the responsibility of the Ministry of Justice to maintain the completeness of the database.
 1. The Ministry of Justice shall have the powers to categorise the database as
 2. The Ministry of Justice shall have the responsibility to ensure that the database is up to date at all times. This responsibility includes:
 - a. Adding all new legislative documents to the database once passed through parliament.
 - b. Adding all old legislative documents that are discovered to the database as they are discovered.
 - iii. It is the responsibility of the Ministry of the Interior to notify the Ministry of Justice of newly passed Acts of Parliament, Imperial Decrees or any other legislative documents.
 1. When an Act of Parliament is passed, it shall be the responsibility of the Ministry of the Interior to notify the Ministry of Justice of the passing of such legislation and to submit this in a timely manner.
 - a. A timely manner is to be defined as no more than 72 hours following the passage of this legislation.
 - i. If the time constraint is not met then it must be resubmitted for Royal Assent.
 - b. The Act of Parliament must be sent in a .pdf digital format.
 2. When an Imperial Decree is passed it shall be the responsibility of the Ministry of the Interior to notify the Ministry of Justice of the passing of such decree and to submit this in a timely manner.
 - a. A timely manner is to be defined as no more than 72 hours following the passage of this legislation.
