GOP eyes end of Russia probes with Trump collusion unanswered

Democrats are likely to be divided over whether to endorse conclusions that don't address the most explosive issue.

EXPLANATION:

To investigate, Congress CAN, without Presidential signature, appoint a Independent Commission

OR

Select Committee

Both are Bipartisan.

This is done by Senate Resolution. (Or House Resolution for a House Special Committee.)

[*Note: The Appropriations Bill for the funding of the Independent Commission does need Presidential signature.]

The DOJ Special Counsel (Mueller) was a good first step.

(Note: The FBI is the Investigative arm of the DOJ.)










State of things in Congressional Investigations:

What are our other options?

Special Counsel

Special Prosecutors are appointed by the Attorney General. Or, if the AG has recused himself, as Sessions has, then by Deputy Attorney General. A Special Prosecutor's job is to investigate if crimes were committed. They do not inform the public.

The DOJ also has the authority to interpret the Emoluments Clause and certain ethics rules that apply to

Cabinet members. (The President and Vice President are exempt from many of the ethics rules.)

Office of Government Ethics

The OGE was formed after Watergate. It vets federal employees across agencies to review their financial disclosures and ensure they comply with conflicts-of-interest rules. Presidents and vice presidents are exempt from many of these rules. The OGE's capacity is to advise. (The Head of the OGE, Walter Shaub, resigned in protest of the lack of ethics adherence shown by this Administration.)

Government Accountability Office

The GOA keeps account of how the government spends taxpayer dollars. (For example, shortly after the election, Sen Warren and Rep Cummings sent a letter to the GAO asking them to look into how taxpayer dollars were spent during the Trump transition.) And, it was announced that they are looking into the Security Expenses of Mar-A-Lago trips. They called the report's findings "alarming" and said they'd keep investigating the spending.

The FBI

The FBI has already stated they are investigating Russian ties. This allegedly continues even with the firing of the current FBI Director Comey.

Inspectors General

IGs are in-house watchdogs in almost all major federal agencies. There is not one in The White House (see PC2A on HR1016 to establish an IG in The White House <https://pc2a.info/HR1016InspectorGeneralInOvalOffice>)

IGs issue public reports; they cannot prosecute but can refer cases to the Justice Department. Here are the reports

State Attorney Generals

State AGs (see @watchyourAGs on Twitter) are limited regarding federal officials but, because Trump owns hundreds of businesses – state AGs have purview over those financial connections. (Which, in theory could lead back to Russian oligarchs.) The Trump Organization is registered in New York, Florida and Delaware.
