Placement Exams for the Major:

1. <u>Math Placement Test</u>- Only if your SAT MAT was less than 550 or your ACT MAT was less than 22. Take this online placement test as soon as possible and prior to registering for classes.

If you don't pass the Math Placement Test with a score of 10 or higher, then register for MAT 1001.

If you score higher than 10 you can take either:

- MAT 1010 (followed later by STT 2810 for the major Stats requirement)
- or you can simply take Statistics (STT) 2820, which covers both the Gen Ed Quantitative Literacy requirement and the major Stats requirement.

First-Year Student Course Recommendations:

- 1. Enroll in **PSY 1200***
- 2. R C 1000 or UCO 1200 if there are seats available. If not, it's fine to take both classes in the spring semester.
- 3. MAT 1010 or Statistics 2820 (see Placement info above)
- 4. A course from the Sustainability & Climate Literacy category (SCL)**
- 5. A course from the Intercultural Literacy category (ICL)**

*PSY 1200 will count as your Humanity & Its Systems category (HUM) course, as well as your Social Science (SS) designation.

**Keep in mind that you will need to fulfill the FA, HS and LS designation requirements, so look for interesting courses in these categories with these designations

Alternative Courses for Your First Semester:

Can't get into the classes above? Try these:

- A <u>Foundations of American Democracy</u> course *unless* you've already met this requirement***
- A General Education ****Science Inquiry course
- A course from the Human Services Concentration section of the PSY Program of Study, such as ASL 3368, LDS 2700, CDE 2101, CDE 2103, CDE 2104, CDE 2110, CDE 2111, CSD 2259,

- CSD 2260, SW 2010, SW 2020, SW 1615, SW 2630, SOC 2020, SOC 2050, SOC 2850, COM 2124, PSY 2211, PSY 2212, PSY 2305.
- Other courses from any category in General Education

***You can check DegreeWorks to see if you already have credit for your Foundations of American Democracy course.

****Note that some science courses need to be taken sequentially (in order). Must have passing Math Placement scores or have completed MAT or STT courses to enroll in a science course. The science themes Chemistry Connections, The Physics of our Technological World and Physics with Calculus are not encouraged. These Inquiries are designed for specific majors (not Psychology).
