### **District Goals**

**Vision: Community beyond the campus; purpose beyond today.** To accomplish the mission, the District has set forth the following goals:

- 1. All students reading and writing at or above grade level;
- 2. Mastery and understanding of skills in literacy, math, science, communication, and problem solving in order to be career and college ready;
- 3. To prepare students to be responsible, compassionate, and productive citizens.
- Prepare students to make career choices and to pursue postsecondary education and/or training after graduation; enlist, enroll, or employ.
- 5. Ensure a safe learning environment for all students.

#### **Improvements and Awards**

- Awarded 2 new grants focused on safety and behavior/mental health.
- Students performing below grade-level are provided intervention services for Reading and Math through the district RTI program. All students K - 10 are receiving intervention services as needs are identified.
- High Impact Tutoring Grant for elementary students.
- VIEW Behavior matrix for positive behavior reinforcement.
- WSD's Pre-K/ABC program continues to run at or near 40 student capacity.
- Students are screened and served for dyslexia if needed.
- Commitment to core subject instruction: Purchase of Amplify science resources to align with state standards. Purchase of new textbooks and supplies for advanced science courses. Implemented IM for math instruction and Benchmark curriculum for Language Arts.
- Currently 8 students are enrolled in concurrent courses at UACCM and 17 students enrolled in concurrent courses via Virtual Arkansas.
- EAST over 100 students involved in self created projects and earned level 2 recognition and 11graduates earned completer chords
- All teachers & admin are working on earning proficiency or awareness level in the Science of Reading as required by October 1, 2023.
- Quiz Bowl Teams are active in the elementary and middle levels with plans for high school this year.
- CTE programs continue to be a priority. 60 Microsoft Office certifications earned during 23-24 and 39 completer chords earned for 2025 graduates.
- Communication and community involvement continues to be a priority.
- BETA students continue community service and fundraising to give back to the community and successfully compete at the state and national levels.
- Band and cheer student participation is growing with outstanding sponsors.
- Athletic programs continue a strong tradition of competition and character.

#### Accreditation

All schools in the Wonderview School District met all standards for accreditation of the Arkansas Department of Education during 2024-2025. All buildings are asbestos free.
