Who will be happy when he sees a policeman standing at the gate with a stick in his hand? One is tempted to ask, "what is the use of this education where policeman are needed for conducting examinations?"

The aim of education is to wipe out the existence of the force. When a father sends his son to school, does he think that his son will become a thief? So it not an irony that parents spend money to see their children thieves, robbers and notorious ones? I call those students thieves who copy in the examination hall at the point of a knife, stick, khukuri, pistol or bayonet are no better than robbers. Can any father be happy when he sees this?
