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ABSTRACT

Abstract writing in English uses an abstract style format, which is written in Book Antiqua letters, size 10pt. Abstracts are written a maximum of 250 words. Abstracts should begin with a clear introduction in two or three sentences that mention the background of the research. Next, explain the common problems being researched. The results are only the main findings that directly answer the research problem. Give a sentence or two that discusses the findings or prospects for research development. The editor reserves the right to edit the Abstract for reasons of clarity.

Keywords: Minimum 3 words and maximum 5 words; sorted in alphabetical order. (Written in Book Antiqua , size 10pt)

1. BACKGROUND (Written in Book Antiqua , size 12pt, Bold)

Write down the background of the research and mention previous research that has been done (Written in Book Antiqua , size 11pt). Mention and explain in detail the issues that need to be answered with your research. It is very important to provide a bibliography in the introduction and the next chapter in this article as a form of originality of the work.

Libraries are used only as references, not directly quoted from the original library. Writing literature in one sentence uses numbers as a reference point. Reference numbers are written in order according to the location of the library that

is connected to the sentence or statement that was first written [1].

2. RESEARCH METHODS (Written in Book Antiqua , size 12pt, Bold)

The method section must be detailed enough to provide an explanation of the research being conducted (Written in Book Antiqua , size 11pt). Sub-chapters can be added to detail the flow or process of the method.

2.1 Addition of sub-chapters.

The addition of sub-chapters is written by giving a sentence of the sub-chapter title before the beginning of the word of the explanation of the sub-chapter and given a

number. The addition of the sub-chapter title sentence is in bold print. Before entering the sub-chapter paragraph, it is given a space of 1 space with the previous paragraph or paragraph [2].

Image names and tables are italicized.

3. RESULTS AND DISCUSSION
(Written in Book Antiqua , size 12pt, Bold)

Be clear about the results you get. End the discussion by providing conclusions and future research on the topic (Written in Book Antiqua , size 11pt). Declare the results obtained based on the method used. Don't display the same data in the form of graphs and tables at once.

Equations. Use Microsoft Equation Editor 3.0 or MathType for all math objects. The numbering of equations follows a right-aligned rule and does not need to be spaced between text and equations, as in the following example:

$$\nabla \times \mathbf{E} = -\frac{\partial \mathbf{B}}{\partial t} \tag{1}$$

E = Electric field
B = Magnetic field

Don't forget to define the symbols in the equation.

Figures and Tables. The images and tables are inserted in the text and arranged in the middle as in the example Figure 1 and Table 1 below. The image caption is placed below the image and is flat in the middle. Except for very detailed images, images should not exceed one column of the page. Color images may be displayed and all images including photos must be included in the text. There is no need for a space between text and images or tables.

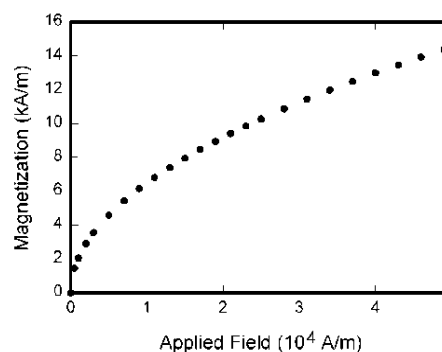

The format of placing the image and writing the caption (Written in Book Antiqua , size 10pt, center).

While the table is written in a format, namely the contents of the table are written in Times New Roman letters, 11pt and full border. The table caption is placed on top of the table and written in the middle square. An example table is as follows,

Both the picture and the table must be written in paragraphs. The description of the picture or table is explained again in 2 or 3 paragraph sentences.

4. CONCLUSION (Written in Book Antiqua , size 12pt, Bold)

Explain the conclusions of the research that has been carried out (Written in Book Antiqua , size 11pt). Writing a conclusion in the form of a paragraph.

5. THANKS (Written in Book Antiqua , size 12pt, Bold)

Mention the source of funding (institution, year of contract) and the name of the person who received the funding (Written in Book Antiqua , size 11pt). Mention the names of the people who helped your research except for the names that have been mentioned as authors above.

BIBLIOGRAPHY (Written in Book Antiqua , size 12pt, Bold, center)

Writing a bibliography uses IEEE style. It is recommended to use tools such as Mendeley, Zotero, or other reference management tools. Example of a bibliography with IEEE style (Written in Book Antiqua , size 11pt).
