Roski School of Art Ruth Weisberg Prize for Drawing

Awarded to one outstanding Roski undergraduate student selected in a highly competitive process each year, this prize could offer you \$6,500 to help you find the research, development, production and gallery presentation of an independent art project. A faculty mentor selected by you will guide you through the different phases of the project from start to finish.

Handtmann Photography Prize

One outstanding third-year undergraduate student at Roski receives this competitive award annually. The prize of up to \$5,000 is intended to help you produce and present a new photographic project, including printing, mounting, framing and installation during the spring of your senior year.

The Rebekah and Howard Farber Fund for Student Excellence

The Rebekah and Howard Farber Fund for Student Excellence seeks out one impressive Roski undergraduate BFA Art or Design student every year, granting \$4,000 to support an endeavor beyond the classroom that has real societal value. The cash can fund work-related research, residencies, an art project and more.

Macomber Travel Grant

This award supports ambitious Roski MFA Art graduate students, along with third-year undergraduate students, involved in projects where research-based travel is key. It requires the winner or winners—the grant may go to an individual or a group—to make a public presentation of their project and findings.

Price Student Organization support

Applications must be submitted through the Price Student Organization Purchase Request form no less than 10 business days prior to your event for purchases less than \$850. For purchases in excess of \$850, please submit the form no less than 30 calendar days before your event. All forms not submitted within the proper timelines will not be able to be filled or reimbursed. You must have completed and approved permits before applying for funding (when applicable) Any event operating without proper approval or permits will not be reimbursed and could result in disciplinary action

Production proposals will include a completed script for a short narrative film, 8-15 minutes in length, a story synopsis, shooting schedule and a budget. Previously completed films will not be accepted.

Two Screenwriting Grants are offered annually for \$17,500 each

Screenwriting proposals will include either a completed original feature film narrative script, a television movie script, or a television pilot script that meet the Sloan criteria.

One Animation Grant is offered for \$13,500

Proposals should include a playable prototype, game design document, concept art, production schedule, and budget.
