Physics Students Construct Junior Solar Sprint Cars!

Kristen Tomasicchio from Avenues in Motion gave a workshop to the Physics Fundamentals classes in order to support the students in their building of their Junior Solar Sprints cars. The goal of the project is to have the students design a solar car to move along a 66 ft track with the use of a solar panel. The project is embedded with not just engineering but with science, math and technology (STEM) as well. Our students

will be looking at ways to maximize the best use of physics, science and engineering practices and crosscutting concepts, specifically energy and matter and system and system models, to have the fastest moving car on the track. The experiments that will be student designed and driven by the SEPs will be infused with the NJSLA math standards found in Algebra, Statistics and Probability, and functions. The standards for mathematical practice are embedded as well. We are looking to work in conjunction with other STEM areas in our school to allow for the building of pieces for our cars through the process of 3D printing. The students will create a video journal of their research and process that will be submitted. The top 65 cars in the state will move on to a state competition to be held in the spring.
