I would like to be treated like a mature and responsible young adult; therefore, I will act as such. Because my attitude and behavior are critical to the success of this trip, I will adhere to the following rules:

- I will stay with the group at all times and not wander off. I will notify my buddy, leader, and co-leader anytime I would like to leave the group (bathroom breaks, etc).
- I will be patient and courteous with the other girls that are enjoying this trip with me.
- I will be respectful and polite to the adults that have given up their time to take my troop on this trip.
- I will clean up after myself and keep my belongings picked up and out of the way this includes the hotel room and bathroom.
- I will be responsible for all of my personal items including cell phones and chargers.
- I will be respectful of quiet times and bedtime and remember that a good night's sleep is the first step to having a great time the next day.
- I will have a positive, cooperative attitude with the rest of the group. I understand that there will be no whining, complaining or arguing tolerated.

 will not climb or stand on monuments, benches, trees or other displays that are not
 meant for that purpose. I understand that the use of foul language, alcohol, illegal or
 unauthorized drugs, or tobacco products will not be tolerated.
- I understand that at certain points of this trip, cell phones will not be allowed to be used. I also understand that flash photography will not be allowed during certain parts of the trip.
- I will pack my own things and carry my luggage to and from vehicles. I will pack and carry my own backpack each day without assistance from the leaders. I will carry my own water bottle and stay hydrated.
- I also understand that if I am unable to adhere to these behavior expectations, there will be consequences to be determined by the leaders. The consequences could include being sent home or not being allowed to participate in any subsequent troop travel.
- I will strive to use my best manners at all times and to say please and thank you whenever possible.
