 - Just want to keep in shape in the winter or enjoy running? This is an informal group that runs for fun in the winter (mid-November through early March).
- **MATH PACKERLAND TEAM** (Mr. Schleis)

You will have the opportunity to participate in a real trial setting without the actual consequences. The team will meet to practice and prepare their case throughout the season.  - Come and work on or off the stage! Every fall, the performing arts department prepares a musical that includes acting, singing, and dancing. Audition dates may vary. Students are also invited to help construct the set and work with the running crew for the performance.

If you have a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or above, you are eligible to apply for membership after the first semester of your sophomore year. You must have attended LC for at least one semester.

 - Want to develop your skills in acting or set building? Try out for the one-act play. The play is 35 minutes long and is critiqued by three judges. The competition begins at the district level and can proceed to sectionals and state. Students perform for other schools and see other schools' dramatic work.
