South Carolina (Original Version)

[A]n increasing hostility on the part of the non-slaveholding States to the institution of slavery, has led to a disregard of their obligations, and the laws of the General Government have ceased to effect the objects of the Constitution. The States of Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts, Connecticut, Rhode Island, New York, Pennsylvania, Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Wisconsin and Iowa, have enacted laws which either nullify the Acts of Congress or render useless any attempt to execute them. In many of these States the fugitive is discharged from service or labor claimed, and in none of them has the State Government complied with the stipulation made in the Constitution. . . .

South Carolina (Modern-Reader Version)

There has been growing hostility from the non-slaveholding states toward slavery, leading them to ignore their constitutional obligations. Because of this, the laws of the federal government no longer achieve the purposes of the Constitution. The states of Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts, Connecticut, Rhode Island, New York, Pennsylvania, Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Wisconsin, and Iowa have passed laws that either nullify acts of Congress or make it impossible to enforce them. In many of these states, enslaved people who escape are released instead of being returned, and none of these states has honored the constitutional requirement to do so.

Part 1: Slaveholders in the Pre-War South

According to the data in Table 1, about 1,050,000 white households lived in the slave states in 1850. About 350,000 households owned slaves. **Calculate:** What was the percentage slaveholding southern households in 1850?

Use the following formula:

$$\text{Percentage of non-slaveholding households} = \left(\frac{\text{Non-slaveholding households}}{\text{Total households}} \right) \times 100$$
