

## **Photos from the Ft. Pearce and Warner Valley Dinosaur Tracks Hike - October 26**



**On October 26 New Promise Hikers hiked the Ft. Pearce and Warner Valley Dinosaur Tracks sites. Both sites are easily accessible by car. The first stop was at the Warner Valley Dino Tracks site, where a good number of dinosaur tracks could be found, left for the most part by two carnivorous dinosaurs: Dilophosaurus, which was a 23 foot long behemoth that weighed more than half a ton, and a man-sized one called Megapnosaurus. The next stop was to the Ft. Pearce area. In addition to the fort, Pearce Wash contained several pioneer names painted with wagon wheel axle grease on the north wash wall near the fort and there were also some petroglyphs just below the fort in the wash. At that point, we proceeded to more petroglyph sites and worked our way toward the famous (but hard to find) large red anthropomorphic pictograph called the Red Man. A bit of a climb to the upper wall of the canyon brought us to the Red Man site and allowed us to visit with the beautiful red guy for a while.**
