Car Pooling Guidelines/Info

UCSF does not provide transportation so our program relies on everyone carpooling or renting a car. Campsites are limited in cars allowed so the more people can carpool the better.

In an effort to appreciate those who are willing to drive their car and take passengers we've created a cost spreadsheet based on California's Travel Reimbursement. Owning a car includes more than the cost of gas. There is insurance, maintenance and depreciation. So, please, chip in when you can.

In 2025, the California mileage reimbursement rate is set at \$0.70 per mile.

Cancellation Policies

Communication is key to the success of the Rec Pass! Just let us know well in advance and we can make it work.

Cancellation Consequences:

- 1) Cancellations **made 2 weeks or more prior** to the first day of a trip receive no consequences. We have enough time to try and fill the spot.
- 2) Cancellations **made 7-13 days prior** to the first day of the trip will be allowed **twice**. A third cancellation made 7-13 days prior to the trip will result in the revocation of your Rec Pass and all future reservations unless a new Rec Pass is purchased. (basically, a \$89 cancellation fee)
- 3) Cancellations **made 3-7 days prior** to the first day of a trip will be allowed **once**. A second cancellation made 3-7 days prior to a trip will result in the revocation of your Rec Pass and all future reservations unless a new Rec Pass is purchased.
- 4) **Cancellations made within 3 days prior** to the first day of a trip will result in the immediate revocation of your rec pass. All registrations for future trips will be cancelled unless a new Rec Pass is purchased.

Fees/Refunds for guests: Fees for guests must be paid 7 days prior to the first day of the trip. No refunds for cancellations within 3 days of pre-tip meeting.

Waitlist-we don't do waitlists

When cancellations occur, I send out an email to everyone with a Rec Pass and it's first come/first serve for the spots. So, if you really want to go on a trip, keep that weekend open and keep checking your emails starting 2 weeks out which is when cancellations usually occur.

Types of Trips offered:

1. Backpacking Trip

- These trips are the most “rugged” of our trips. All gear is carried by participant and meals are simple freeze dried backpacking meals.
- Tents are smaller, 2 person tents and pads are lightweight foam pads.
- Stove kits are provided for pairs of students to share for heating water for meals and drinks.
- Different destinations offer different challenges from easy to strenuous routes.

2. Car Camping Trip

- “Car Camping” implies that your car will be parked at your campsite.
- Car camping trips can have an itinerary where a guide will lead a specific hike or participants may be allowed to explore on their own.
- Meals are prepared by guides include hot drinks, burritos or spaghetti for dinner, a sandwich bar for lunch and pancakes, and other items for breakfast.

3. “Top Shelf” Trips

- These trips are the most sought after trips as the accommodations are not tents but rather include cabins and houses in stunning locations with indoor sleeping. Some may have guides doing the cooking, others may have a kitchen and some will require you to bring your own food. All have an additional “Top Shelf” price added on to the cost of the Rec Pass.

4. Kayak Camping Trips

- This is a unique trip where our equipment and food are similar to a backpacking trip but our destination is only accessible via a kayak! We pack our camping gear in a waterproof bag which is given out at the pre-trip meeting along with backpacking stove kits and freeze dried backpacking meals BUT we don't have to carry our gear on our backs! It all fits nicely in the kayak. Swimming ability and previous kayaking experience required for all kayak camping trips.

Trips in Alphabetical Order

For all Car Camping Trips: Only 1 car is covered per campsite. There is a \$10/additional car/campsite so be prepared to pay this additional fee.

Angel Island Backpacking Trip

We take the ferry over to the Island (either Tiburon or SF) and then hike less than 2 miles to our camp. You can relax in camp or hike the perimeter of the Island (5 miles) for incredible views. Our evening will be a hike to the top of Angel Island for a stunning 360 view of the Bay Area at night.

We recommend just taking mass transit to the SF Ferry Building to avoid parking fees.

Big Sur- Car Camping

These are trips where our tents are next to our cars. Campsites have bathrooms and guides prepare meals. Some hikes are led by guides but participants have options to explore on their own, setting their own pace and challenge level.

Big Sur Coastal Explorer! Ocean Sunsets, Elephant Seals, Waterfalls and More! Car Camping

So much to check out on this trip! We'll stay Friday night at San Simeon where we'll wake up to a view of the ocean. After a simple breakfast, we'll pack up and start exploring the Big Sur Coast before ending up at front row, coastal sites at Kirk Creek Campground.

First stop is the Elephant Seal colony. Just 15 min up the coast is the largest colony of elephant seals (like hundreds!). The 4000 lb males come in, fight over who's the alpha...full on Wild Kingdom moments!

Second stop is lunch at Ragged Point, destination for many weddings!

Third stop is Salmon Creek Falls! Another hour north and you can check out 100 ft Salmon Falls.

Our final destination is Kirk Creek Campground, the only campground right on the bluff, overlooking the ocean...sunset right from our campsites with a cup o' hot cocoa in hand 😊

We'll be camping at **San Simeon State Park** Friday night and **Kirk Creek Campground** Saturday night.

San Simeon State Park has flush toilets and showers so we're camping in comfort.

Kirk Creek Campground is more rustic with vault toilets and no running water.
All food and camping gear Included. Guides will have water for Saturday-Sunday available.

Lake Ahjumawi Kayak Camping and Lassen National Park Exploration!

Lake Ahjumawi is a fresh water paradise where you can see Mt Lassen AND Shasta while floating on the lake! Friday-camp at Manzanita Lake campground in Lassen National Park
 Saturday-It's a 25 min drive to our first stop in this sagebrush and volcanic wonderland at Subway Cave, a lava tube we can walk thru. Then, we'll head north to Burney Falls where we'll go for a short hike and play in the waterfalls—about a 30 min drive from Subway Cave. After lunch, we'll head to Lake Ahjumawi (40 min drive).
 It's a short (45 min) paddle to our lakeside camping spot where we'll unload our camping gear, set up tents and then go explore the lake! Opportunities for short hikes around the lake or just floating in the middle of the lake with a stunning view watching the birds fly by.
 Sunday-breakfast, pack up and paddle back to our cars.

Lassen Volcanic National Park Car Camping

If you cannot arrive by 10 pm to these trips please do not sign up for them!! Our guides and participants need their sleep!

Come on up to Mt Lassen for stunning hikes and mind blowing geothermal areas that are like a mini-Yellowstone in our backyard! We'll hike to the top of Brokeoff Mountain (7.2 miles round trip/2000 ft elevation gain) where we'll be looking out over Mt Lassen from an elevation of over 9000 ft! It's a challenging hike but well worth the incredible views! On our way back to camp we'll go explore the famous Bumpass Hell trail of mudpots, steaming pools and geysers. Manzanita Lake is just minutes from our campsite for a swim and sunset view as Mt Lassen is reflected in its waters turning gold with the sunset.

Enjoy secluded beaches, hikes along the coast, and some of Northern California's best scenic views. It's a 3 hr drive, so we meet at Van Damme beach just south of the town of Mendocino on Saturday at 1 pm. You'll check in, change and then go out for a 2 hr kayak trip thru the tunnels, arches and rocks of the Mendocino Coast! Afterwards, we'll drive the 4 miles north to Russian Gulch State Park, set up camp and enjoy a little beach time, walk to a bluff for sunset and relax by the fire. Sunday, we'll go for a short walk along the bluffs of Russian Gulch exploring more stunning coastline with arches and sea caves after breakfast. Trip ends at 11 am on Sunday.

Pinnacles Condors and Car Camping

Just 2 ½ hrs south of San Francisco, this gem of the National Park system comes with stunning views, amazing rock formations, carpets of wildflowers and even a bat cave! Stinson Beach Steep Ravine Cabin Trips

We'll share a cabin right on the bluff where we can watch the sun set into the ocean. Dinner and breakfast provided as well as any gear you may need will be brought out (sleeping bag/pad). Show up for dinner (No Pre-Trip!) watch the sunset, hang out around the wood burning stove or campfire and play board games and wake up to a gorgeous morning overlooking the ocean...or head home to sleep in your own bed.

The cabins are very rustic. Just a table, benches and wood burning stove. The beds are wooden platforms so we bring sleeping pads and bags. No electricity and bathrooms w/running water are a short walk.

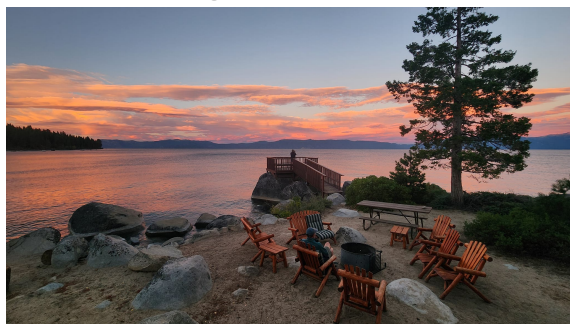

In addition to numerous boulders along the shore to let your mind wander there is a private, sandy beach to swim or just relax in the sun.

There is a BBQ station with another epic view where we’ll provide group dinners Friday (spaghetti) and Saturday night (sausage and portabella mushrooms) and then gather around the campfire by the private dock under the stars.

If you cannot arrive by 11 pm to these trips please do not sign up for them!! Our guides and participants need their sleep!

Campsites are harder than ever to get nowadays so we book these rooms a year in advance! Read more about the trip below, talk to your friends and decide if you want to go. Definitely recommend getting a group of 4-6 together to share the rooms.

These trips rely on people sharing rooms and beds. Each room has 2-3 beds that sleep 2 people/bed and we aim to fill every spot. So, if you're not comfortable with this

arrangement I wouldn't recommend registering for one of these trips. The camping trips are better suited for more privacy.

You will be in a room with 3 double beds with 2 people sharing a bed. So, think about this and be ok with the sleeping accommodations.

Arrive Friday no later than 11 pm. So, if you can't leave SF before 6 pm (Friday traffic is heavy) please do not sign up for this trip.

Stoneman House FAQ's

- The rooms come with pillows, blankets and towels.
- There is a bathroom with toilet and shower in addition to a sink. You can fill up water bottles in the sink.
- There are electric outlets but no coffee maker, microwave, toaster oven, refrigerator, etc or other devices in the room. No phones, no TV, nada.
- There are no campfire facilities at the Stoneman House.
- If you need anything or if there is a problem with the room, the Curry Village Registration office is open 24/7 and can help you out.
- There is housekeeping that usually provides new towels, toilet paper each day.
- There is a covered deck all around the Stoneman House and chairs as well to allow opportunity to hang out even if it is raining.
