Welcome to the Hunger Games Crisis Committee at RIDGEMUNC II! The Hunger Games is a dystopian novel by Suzanne Collins, written in 2008. In the story, the Capitol of a nation called Panem holds a deadly competition called the Hunger Games, where two tributes from each district of the country must fight to the death. The book explores themes of survival, rebellion, and government control, and has become a highly acclaimed and influential work in the dystopian genre. The success of this series has led to the creation of a highly successful film franchise and solidified The Hunger Games as one of the most influential works of dystopian literature in recent years. Due to the fictional nature of this committee, some source material will have to be improvised by delegates. However, we would prefer for positions to be represented as close to the material provided in this guide as possible.

Committee Background

The Hunger Games takes place in the dystopian nation of Panem. This nation was established after the end of the modern world due to several major disasters that left only a bit of land on the continent of North America. There, Panem was established. The idea of Panem was to restore stability and balance in the world, so Panem was divided into thirteen districts. Each district has their own industry, and citizens work with the promise that their lives will be “satisfactory” as long as they work tirelessly to support Panem and the Capitol. The Capitol is the center of Panem and is rather wealthy and powerful compared to the state of the Districts, and controls all district operations. While the Capitol assumed the districts were satisfied with the arrangement, the Districts were unhappy with this level of control and restriction the Capitol was enforcing.

The District's unrest towards the Capitol rule led to a three year long rebellion. For the first two years of this war, the Districts seemed to have the upper hand. Since the Capitol relied on the Districts and their industries in order to function, being cut off from the Districts as a result of the war proved to be detrimental to the Capitol. They counted on the resources of the Districts for their citizens' survival, so many died of starvation. The Districts also bombed the Capitol regularly as an action of war. This upperhand was short-lived, however. When rebel forces decided to invade the Capitol, it did not play well for them. Capitol forces were able to locate and bomb them, resulting in massive casualties on the rebel side. This devastated the rebel forces, and allowed the beginning steps of the Capitol to slowly secure victory.

At that point in the war, the Districts became quickly aware that victory was not possible. Hence, District 13 chose to abandon the other rebel districts in the hopes of securing their own victory. Given District 13 had the industry of nuclear weapons, this appeared to be quite the threat to The Capitol. To diffuse the threat of District 13, the Capitol and District 13 settled a ceasefire deal. The Capitol would destroy District 13, and it would go underground, giving the impression that it had disappeared. The Capitol proposed this as they thought the District would



not survive very long without outside resources. Given that the resources of District 13 were vital to the rebel war effort, without them the rebels quickly lost the war.

To end this era known as the “dark days” the Treaty of Treason was established. This treaty was created to enforce peace, and remind District citizens that the dark days must never be repeated. The treaty also created the annual event the Hunger Games, with the idea that it would keep the Districts divided in order to discourage another rebellion, as well as enforce the Capitol’s superiority.

Leading up to the annual Hunger Games competition, each District hosts a reaping, where the tributes are selected. Each District will have two tributes, one boy and one girl. The tributes are supposed to fight to the death, until one victor is pronounced. In the 74th annual Hunger Games, District Twelve’s Katniss Everdeen volunteered to take the place of her sister, Primrose Everdeen. She worked with District Twelve’s second tribute, Peeta Mellark throughout the games. At the end, they were the final two standing. Even though they were told that the game allowed an exception of two victors from the same district, the game maker decided to change the rules at the last second, and only permitted one victor. Instead of fighting to the death, Katniss Everdeen handed Peeta Mellark a Nightlock berry, and they prepared to consume them. Nightlock berries are known to be extremely poisonous, so consuming them would lead to Katniss and Peeta’s death. The game master, Seneca Crane, realized this, and allowed them to both emerge from the games as victors.

Katniss Everdeen’s use of the berries in the 74th Hunger Games was viewed as an action of rebellion towards the Capitol. She had found a way to get around their restrictions, and actively standing against the Capitol by refusing to play into their game was seen as a spark of rebellion. Katniss Everdeen then became a threat in the eyes of the Capitol, as district citizen’s were using her as a symbol of the second rebellion. The Capitol did not appreciate this, and set up the 75th Hunger Games to consist of only previous victors from the districts. Knowing that Everdeen was the only female victor from District 12, the Capitol, specifically President Snow,

knew that she would be selected as a tribute. They hoped that she would die in the games, as the Capitol leaders intended that her death would deter rebellion.

President Snow worked to ensure that the games included as many obstacles as possible, with the intention that Katniss would make herself unpopular with the other competitors and get killed. Katniss however, did quite well in the games and secured many allies. Yet, towards the end of the game Katniss became unsure of who she can trust. When pointing an arrow at one of her allies, Finnick, she is reminded by him of “who the real enemy is” and shoots the arrow at the arena forcefield instead. This causes a massive blackout in the arena, and the Capitol loses control of the games. A hovercraft full of rebels against President Snow then comes and takes Katniss. In the rebel aircraft, Everdeen is taken to the underground District 13 where she meets President Coin, and joins the second rebellion to fight against the Capitol President Snow.



Situation

This crisis committee will take place after rebel forces have taken over the Capitol. After months of traveling across Districts to encourage the rebellion, the rebel forces finally made their way to the Capitol. Once the rebel forces are inside the Capitol and closing in on President Snow's mansion, a series of bombs, spectated by Katniss to be from the rebel side, are dropped. The explosion causes many to blackout, but when Everdeen awoke she was informed by Haymitch that the rebels had won the war. Katniss then goes to meet President Snow, who was being held Prisoner and awaiting execution in his greenhouse.

In their discussion, Snow reveals that the bombs that killed many were from the rebel side, and were only made to look as if they were from the Capitol side in order to turn Snow's supporters against him. Knowing that the bombs that killed many were from the rebel side, tension rises. Coin then declares herself as President of Panem, and hosts a discussion between all surviving victors, and district representatives to restructure the government.

In this committee, delegates will simulate this discussion using their given positions to argue their characters' sides when restructuring the government and grappling with imperative issues to determine the future structure of Panem, the future of the Capitol's citizens, and the legacy of the Hunger Games.



Discussion Topics

Topic 1: Restructuring Panem's Government

The goals of the rebellion lie in the liberation of the 13 districts from the Capitol's oppressive rule. This means that as a committee, the individuals representing each district and group must come to a consensus on how Panem is governed moving forward. Ideally, the decision will be a form of government that satisfies each body's priorities and values, but due to ulterior motives and the complex nature of the situation, this cannot be promised.

Along with the governing structure, another thing that needs to be discussed is the operation of Panem as a global figure. The harnessing and distribution of resources will have to be addressed, along with the economic position of each district within the country. It will have to be decided how the nation will settle domestic disputes in the future, and how economics will contribute to these issues. International matters can also be factored in when looking at the function of Panem as a united, sovereign nation.

Topic 2: Citizens of the Capital

Those currently living in the Capitol will have to be addressed in this committee as well. Some Capitol citizens, namely children, are oblivious to the horrors of the Hunger Games, and the Capitol's atrocities against the districts. Others do understand the government's tyrannical role, but have grown up in a society that normalizes it and therefore have come to take pleasure in it as well. There are also citizens that actively partake in the oppression of Panem's citizens, such as gamemakers, peacekeepers, and government officials.

This committee has the task of deciding how to differentiate each group and their treatment. This could mean educational reform for children, taxing of adults, and criminal charges for government officials. It could also mean a complete dismantlement of Capitol society by relocating all citizens to the districts. The solution of this matter is up to the committee as a



whole, but of course certain positional biases will lead to conflict on how to humanely deal with citizens of the Capitol.

A special case within this topic is President Snow. As the top government official and the face of Panem's oppressive government, a separate conversation will have to be had on how to deal with Coriolanus Snow, whether this be forgiveness, imprisonment, or assassination. It's also important to recognize the influence Snow has on powerful Capitol citizens, and how dealings with Snow may benefit or harm Panem in the future.

Topic 3: Legacy of the Hunger Games

The Hunger Games have been part of Panem for 76 years. Their impact on the people of Panem needs to be discussed and adjusted. This means talking about the generational trauma that the games have caused, and how the constant power imbalance has created an unequal society with internalized issues and demoralized populations. Reparations towards families of tributes should be looked at, along with the impact the games have had in terms of mental health and wellbeing. The addressing of biases against various districts through the games also needs to occur in this committee, as it could cause future conflict between parties of different origins.

There are also some positions that believe the Hunger Games should be continued, with Capitol children as tributes. This is a part of the topic that should be discussed, as it sets a major precedent for how Panem will govern and treat its citizens post rebellion. If a Capitol Hunger Games is agreed upon, the logistics of the event should be agreed upon by committee members, including frequency, participants, and intensity of the Games.



Key terms

Career District - These are districts that are in favor of the Hunger Games, specifically districts 1, 2, and 4. They raise their children to be ready for the Hunger Games, and they endure various training sessions in combat and survival skills to promote their success in the games.

Districts - The nation of Panem is divided into thirteen districts and the Capitol. However only twelve districts are recognized, as the thirteenth went underground after being destroyed by the Capitol as a result of being the face of the first rebellion. Each district specializes in a specific industry, and all of their forced labor and industry production is done to benefit those in The Capitol. The districts have no political voice, and are dictated by Capitol leaders and President Snow.

District 1 - District 1 specializes in the luxury industry. They produce luxury items for The Capitol, such as jewelry. District 1 is viewed as rather wealthy compared to the other districts, as they produce such luxurious items. District 1 is also viewed as one of the most important districts in the eyes of the Capitol, since they work specifically to aid the Capitol, and their craft is used as decoration and aiding the luxurious endeavors of the Capitol.

District 2 - District 2 works in masonry and manufacturing weapons. Their work supplies the peacekeepers. They also are the Capitols most loyal district, and therefore receive many extra benefits and resources from the Capitol. Since the District is known for their weapon manufacturing, their army, the nut, is also well known and respected.

District 3 - District 3 is known for its electronic industry, as well as mechanical production. Due to the district's emphasis on electronics and mechanical engineering, many of the district's citizens are knowledgeable on various technologies.

District 4 - District 4 works as a fishing industry, hence its residents are quite knowledgeable of marine life, crafting/using fishing tools, and surviving in water. District 4 is also a career district.



District 5 - District 5 is the electricity industry. They work to power all of Panem with their hydroelectric dam. However, the dam was destroyed in *Mockingjay* part 1 by the rebels in order to cut off the Capitol's electricity.

District 6 - District 6 is the transportation industry. District 6 served as the main transportation hub for all of Panem. They were outwardly involved in the rebellion, and were consequently bombed by the Capitol.

District 7 - District 7 industry is lumber, and is conveniently surrounded by forest. District 7 residents are known for being good with tools such as axes, hatches, and saws.

District 8 - District 8 is the textiles industry. It hosts many factories, including one used to make peacekeeper uniforms. They strongly supported the rebellion, as they were the first district to rebel, and were led by Commander Paylor.

District 9 - District 9 specializes in the grains industry. It includes many factories for producing grains, however this did not support the wealth of citizens, so District 9 civilians are large supporters of the rebellions.

District 10 - District 10 works as the livestock industry. They produce various livestock that goes to feed the Capitol, and they are a rather poor district.

District 11 - District 11 is known as the agriculture industry. What they grow mainly goes to the Capitol, and they produce various agricultural necessities in their large fields. District 11 is greatly poor, and its citizens live in shacks that are frequently monitored by peacekeepers.

District 12 - District 12 is the coal industry. It was a rather poor and small district, and was destroyed by the Capitol at the beginning of the second rebellion.



District 13 - District 13 on the outside appeared to specialize in mining graphite. However, it was destroyed by the Capitol since it was the face of the rebellion during the dark days. The district then continued to operate underground, and operated as a nuclear weaponry industry.

Game Makers - Game Makers are in charge of producing the Hunger Games, and work to make them as entertaining as possible for the spectators. This is often done by placing various challenges and obstacles in the competitors' way throughout their journey in the games.

Mentor - Previous winners from the Hunger Games will aid the new competitors from their district throughout their journey in the Hunger Games.

Mutt - Genetically modified and Capitol constructed organism that works to benefit the Capitol.

Panem - Panem is the nation in which the Hunger Games series takes place. It is a dystopian nation, established after the end of the modern world, as a result of several major disasters. Panem is divided into thirteen districts, and a Capitol. Only twelve districts are recognized by the Capitol, as the thirteenth district went underground after being destroyed by the Capitol as a result of being the face of the first rebellion.

Peacekeeper - These are soldiers enlisted by the Capitol to promote peace within the districts. However, they often instigate more violence rather than promote peace.

Quarter Quell - Every twenty-five years since the Treaty of Treason, the Hunger Games are given a special treatment that will be different every Quarter Quell. They are often different versions compared to the usual form of the Hunger Games. For example, in the first Quarter Quell districts voted in their participants, in the second there were four participants in each district compared to the usual two, and in the third past victors were the only eligible participants.

Reaping - The Reaping is the name of the district ceremony where the tributes from each district are selected.

The Capitol - The Capitol is the city at the center of Panem. It is quite advanced, and contrasting to the dystopian districts, it is a rather utopian society. Its citizens are dressed to the nines, as fashion is important to the Capitol citizens to indicate their wealth and power. The Capitol is powered by forced labor of the districts citizens and the district's industries, showing the power imbalance. All of the nation's most powerful figures reside there, and the districts are ruled by the Capitol, specifically by President Snow.

The Dark Days - Approximately seventy-four years before the events of the Hunger Games series the districts rebelled against the oppressive Capitol. However the rebellion was not successful, and the Capitol defeated the twelve districts, while fully destroying the thirteenth. This first rebellion is referred to as the “dark days.”

The Treaty of Treason - This treaty was put in place after the Dark Days. It was set up to promote peace after that first rebellion, and set up the Hunger Games, with the hopes that it would keep the districts divided (to prevent rebellion) and remind the district citizens that the Dark Days rebellion must not be repeated.

Tributes - Tributes are the citizens selected to participate in the hunger games. There is one boy and one girl selected from each district, with their ages ranging from 12-18.



Position Guide

Caesar Flickerman - Caesar is a charismatic and flamboyant television host who is known for his colorful appearance and engaging personality. He serves as the host of the annual Hunger Games, during which he interviews the tributes and provides commentary. Caesar is a native of the Capitol, and genuinely enjoys the process of the Hunger Games and their theatrics.

Coriolanus Snow - Snow is the calculating and tyrannical President of Panem. He hides a ruthless drive for power and control, using any means necessary to maintain his rule, including subjecting the Districts to the horrors of the Hunger Games. Snow was born and brought up in the Capitol, and has worked as a Gamemaker and Peacekeeper before ultimately becoming President of Panem.

Lucia - Lucia is a Gamemaker during the 74th Hunger Games. During these games, she unleashes cruel conditions on tributes in the arena, such as mutts and synthetic fire. Lucia resides in the Capitol, and her job is to make the Hunger Games entertaining for Capitol citizens, whilst sending a gruesome message to the people of the districts who are watching the games.

Cressida - Cressida is Capitol born, but fled to District 13 during the rebellion. Her previous involvement in the Capitol's media and film industry grants her a unique perspective on manipulation and storytelling. Through her lens and in collaboration with the rebellion movement, the harsh reality of the Capitol's oppression is unveiled, helping to unite the Districts against their oppressors.

Effie Trinket - Effie is an escort for District 12, meaning she accompanies the District 12 tributes to the Hunger Games each year. As a Capitol native, she is upbeat, shallow, and peppy, despite the grim nature of the Hunger Games. However, Effie's growing attachment to Katniss and Peeta results in her going against the Capitol and aiding the rebellion movement.



Plutarch Heavensbee - Plutarch is the head Gamemaker during the 75th Hunger Games. He has a calm and strategic demeanor that hides his allegiance to the rebellion against the Capitol.

Plutarch's subtle manipulation within the Games' design, coupled with his collaboration with Katniss Everdeen allow him to effectively serve as a commander within District 13 and aid the rebellion's efforts.

Tigris Snow - Tigris is a former Capitol stylist, and operates a clothing shop during the Second Rebellion. Despite being a Snow, specifically the cousin of Coriolanus Snow, Tigris has an allegiance with the rebel movement and aids Katniss during the seizing of the Capitol.

Throughout the Second Rebellion, she houses refugees and aids rebels, serving as one of the few Capitol citizens to help overthrow Panem's government.

Augustus Braun - Augustus is a Victor from the Career district of District 1, a title which he earned during the 67th Hunger Games. He was not reaped for the 75th Hunger Games, which featured only past Victors, and has made it out of the Victor's Purge alive, allowing him to represent District 1 in this committee. He is bright, optimistic, and patriotic, firmly supporting Panem's pre-rebellion government.

Enobaria - Enobaria is from District 2, which is a Career district, and won the 62nd Hunger Games, making her a Victor. She was reaped for the 75th Hunger Games, and afterwards joined the rebellion movement, despite her district still being allied with the Capitol. Enobaria is fierce and violent, and believes in the continuation of the Hunger Games with Capitol children as a form of retaliation.

Betee Latier - Beetee is a quiet and resourceful tribute from District 3. He won an unknown Hunger Games, and was reaped for the 75th Hunger Games. Beetee is known for his remarkable ability to create and manipulate advanced weaponry and devices, which provide considerable aid to the rebellion movement. In the arena, he helped protect Katniss and get her out safely so that the rebel movement could advance.



Annie Cresta - Annie is from the Career district of District 4, and won the 70th Hunger Games. This experience damaged her mental health, but she still managed to fall in love with Finnick Odair, another District 4 Victor that died during the Second Rebellion. Annie is very kind and forgiving, so she would naturally be against another Hunger Games or a tyrannical form of government.

Porter Tripp - Porter is from District 5, and earned the title of Victor after winning the 38th Hunger Games. She has been a mentor to other District 5 tributes, and lives a quiet life out of the Capitol's eyes after suffering a spinal injury during her Games. Her resolved but resilient nature has allowed her to survive the Victor's Purge, and she serves as the representative for District 5 in this committee.

Friselle Peacestar - Friselle is an ordinary citizen from District 6. She works in a plane manufacturing plant, but during the rebellion aids the rebel movement by sabotaging some planes in the factory. The Capitol bombings on her district destroy her home. Friselle's bravery and courage in this situation is rewarded with the chance to represent the people of District 6 in this committee.

Johanna Mason - Johanna is a Victor from District 7, a title she received after winning the 71st Hunger Games. She was reaped for the 75th Hunger Games, and joined an alliance to protect Katniss within the arena. Later on, Johanna was part of Squad 451, one of many that worked to infiltrate the Capitol. She is clever and bold, but feels hatred towards the Capitol for what they did to her and her family.

Commander Paylor - Paylor is a rebel commander from District 8. She is brave and resourceful, with her quick thinking aiding Katniss in dire situations. Paylor also has faith in Katniss, and supports her when she tries to find information from Snow. However, Paylor does not believe in revenge against the Capitol or harming Capitol children, and serves as a representative for her district's people in this committee.



Neem Lowway - Neem is a young factory worker from District 9 who's older brother was a Victor in a past Hunger Games. During the rebellion, he kept his head low, but internally supported it, and his brother was killed during the Victor's Purge. As an immediate family member of the most recent Victor from his district, Neem will represent District 9 at this committee.

Trillium Mildsong - Trillium is from District 10, where she works on a family farm alongside her siblings. She is a strong supporter of the rebellion, as she believes its success will allow her to receive a proper education. Since District 10 was heavily bombed by the Capitol, Trillium is one of few surviving individuals and will represent the remainder of her people in this committee.

Collic Bellberg - Collic is the son of the mayor of District 11. As the mayor's son he was able to get out before the Capitol took great action against the rebellious citizens of his district. Due to his familial ties, Collic feels the rebellion is not necessary and a waste of resources. He is the only individual from District 11 willing to serve as a representative for this committee.

Gale Hawthorne - Gale is a close friend of Katniss from District 12 and serves as a soldier for the rebel effort during the Second Rebellion. He also works as an engineer, designing various traps and devices, one of which ultimately kills Katniss's sister. Gale is a key figure in the fall of the Capitol with his membership of Squad 451.

Haymitch Abernathy - Haymitch is the second ever Victor from District 12, which he became by cleverly winning the 50th Hunger Games. He is a mentor to Katniss and Peeta during their Games, along with a main coordinator of the Second Rebellion. Haymitch stands behind Katniss throughout the rebellion and will always side with her, despite his cynical attitude.

Katniss Everdeen - Katniss is the face of the Second Rebellion, a title she acquires after winning the 74th Hunger Games with Peeta, in a show of defiance against the Capitol. She is not very social, and a serious person overall, but her survival skills and logical mindset allow her to



inspire the districts into rebellion. Due to her high involvement, her opinion on Panem's matters post rebellion is highly valued.

Peeta Mellark - Peeta is the second victor of the 74th Hunger Games, placing a spotlight on him along with Katniss regarding the rebel movement. He constantly supports Katniss during various efforts, and his mild but resilient nature, along with his social skills get the nation of Panem on their side. He would focus on mental help for survivors of the Games and Rebellion, rather than vengeance.

Romulus Thread - Romulus is a Peacekeeper, specifically the Head of Peacekeepers for District 12 after the 74th Hunger Games. He is cruel, violent, and vicious, believing in harsh physical punishments for minor crimes. Romulus disagrees with the premise of rebellion, and attempts to settle it in District 12, but is transported out after things escalate. He will serve as a representative for the Peacekeeping Department in this committee.

Alma Coin - Alma is a District 13 native, hiding from the Capitol's reach her whole life, and eventually becoming President of District 13. She, along with others within and out of District 13 lead the Second Rebellion, orchestrating various attacks and movements to invade and take down the Capitol. As one of the leading figures of the rebel movement, she currently serves as interim President of Panem.

York - York is a soldier from District 13, where she trains younger individuals to go into combat against the Capitol. She trains Johanna and Katniss, using various tactics and strategies to help them excel in their training. She is strict and disciplined, and has grown up in District 13 her whole life, giving her a certain bias to the rebel movement and its goals.
