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Extremes

- Four most north/south/east/west points in Europe
 - Northern-most – Cape Nordkinn (Norway)
 - Souther-most – Punta de Tarifa (Spain)
 - Eastern-most – Sulina (Romania)
 - Western-most – Cabo da Roca (Portugal)

Iceland

- Diving at the Silfra fissure – a crack between the North American and Eurasian continental plates
- Other things to see in Iceland
 - GRJÓTAGJÁ (heard is a must do), The Elephant Rock, Gullfoss, Gljúfrabúi Waterfall, Vatnajökull National Park

Denmark/Southern Sweden

- Copenhagen (World's most bikeable city!)
 - Jump on the trampolines found in the middle of their city and stroll through Nyhavn around the corner
 - Check out Christiania (a “self-proclaimed autonomous neighborhood”, basically a free weed zone which the government has let be. Even if you don't smoke, it's very interesting culturally). Cool graffiti.
 - Check out Tivoli (second oldest amusement park – even if you're not into the rides, it's nice) or take a bike ride to Bakken (world's oldest amusement park)
 - Climbing up the church's tower gives a good view of the city
 - Little mermaid statue is famous but not that exciting
 - National gallery of Denmark is actually pretty nice if you're into museums at all
 - If you're lucky enough, [Karneval](#) once every four years
- Nimis
 - Nearby there is a place called Nimis (Ladonia). It is this incredible wooden structure (that you can climb up and through) that an artist named Lars Vilks spent years secretly building without the knowledge of the Swedish government. It is not on any maps but is known to many in Lund and it definitely worth the visit. Take a second to look it up, but 100% worth it even if you don't plan on visiting Lund.
 - Sauna on the sea – exactly as it sounds (FYI Swedes sauna naked)

Northern Scandinavia

- LAPLAND (Saariselka, there may be other places)
 - See the Northern Lights, almost guaranteed
 - The biggest toboggan run in the world
 - Take a road to the North Pole meet the “Real Santa Claus”
 - Meet and/or ride with some huskies
- Stockholm – Big city, and can take ferries to Tallinn, Helsinki, etc.
- Other cool places to check out:
 - Kakslauttanen (glass igloos)
 - The Treehotel
 - The Swedish Ice Hotel: Jukkasjärvi
 - Sørvágsvatn/Leitisvatn Lake, Faroe Islands

Norway

- Hike the Preikestolen (Pulpit) cliff and Troll Tongue (Trolltunga)
- Lofoten – “Due to the warm Gulf Stream, Lofoten has a much milder climate than other parts of the world at the same latitude. Between late May and mid July you can experience the midnight sun, whilst the northern lights can be viewed from September to mid April.”

Scotland

- Edinburgh
 - Go during Edinburgh’s Fringe Festival (August 5-29). The city genuinely lights up.
 - If not during Fringe, check out Scotland during Xmas/Hogmonay
 - Climb Arthur’s seat
- Ashton Lane (Glasgow)
- Fingal’s Cave
- Hunt for Nessie at Loch Lommond
- Isle of Skye

England

- Summer Solstice at Stonehenge
- Glastonbury – largest greenfield music festival (June 25-29)
- Bletchley Park (re: Imitation Game)

France

- Normandy (D-Day Beach)
- Cannes Film Festival and Monaco Grand Prix – these are actually right next to each other and you can see the set for the GP weeks before
- Biarritz (surf coastal town)

Spain

- Pamplona – Running with the Bulls (July 6th to 14th)
- Gaztelugatxe – Island off Spain connected by walking bridge
- La Tomatina – The World's Largest Foodfight, over 150k tomatoes are thrown (Last Weds in August)
- Concurs de Castells (October) – famous Spanish tradition of building massive human structures
- Walk part (or all) of the Camino de Santiago Trail – I'm sure you have heard of this; it is a pilgrimage route between France and Spain which many people take for non-religious reasons.
- Take some time in the Oiartzun Forest
- Zipline from Spain to Portugal and go “back in time”
- Climb a Mountain and join the Haro Wine Festival (June 28-30)

Portugal

- Eat a Toblerone in front of the Toblerone mountain (near Zermatt)
- Skydive at Interlaken (...this is the dream), or tandem paragliding
- Bungee jump like 007 at Verzasca Dam

Italy

- Lake Reschen for Italy's drowned city and Venice for the drowning city (+Burano)
