- STP's Annual Conference on Teaching (ACT) 2025 will be held at the <u>Royal Sonesta</u> Hotel in downtown Minneapolis, MN, October 16-18, 2025.
- The conference begins on a Thursday evening and concludes on a Saturday evening.
- Conference registration will open in June.

Submission Types:

We are accepting proposals in the following categories:

- Posters
- Participant Idea Exchanges (1-hour round-table discussions)
- 2-hour Workshops
- 10-15 minute Live Teaching Demonstrations
- 25- or 45-minute Symposia

Submission Guidelines:

All submission categories require:

- Corresponding author name and email address
- First author name, institution, position, and email address
- Additional author names
- Type of submission (see above)
- A brief title that clearly communicates what the session is about
- A 50-word (max) submission summary that will be placed into the conference program
- A 300-word (max) description that will be used to evaluate the submission according to 1) Importance, 2) Novelty, and 3) Interest to Attendees
- Choice of up to three submission "tags" for the conference app: Best Practices, Scholarship of Teaching and Learning, Professional Development, Community Building, Online or Hybrid, A.I., Intro Psych, "Something for Monday", International Psychology, Community College, Early Career, Psych Majors and Career, Large Classes, Self-Care

Important Submission Considerations:

- Due to high demand, submitters may only serve as the first author on 1 Symposium or Workshop (no limit on Posters, PIEs, or Demo submissions). Additionally, they may only be included as an author on as many as 3 total Symposia or Workshops (no limit on Posters, PIEs, or Demo submissions).
- This form should be completed multiple times for authors wishing to submit more than one presentation.
- All communications to teams of authors will occur between the ACT Director, Garth Neufeld, and the corresponding author <u>only</u>. Corresponding authors should plan on

forwarding correspondences from the ACT Director to their authorship teams. The email will come from annual-conference@teachpsych.org.
