Develop a Strategy for Improvement

Student survey results provide valuable information about how your students experience instructional practices at your school. The student data report provides detailed student feedback that you can use to better understand your students' perceptions about their classroom experience. This data provides valuable insight into the strengths and weaknesses of your school's instructional culture from the students you serve and can be an opportunity to acknowledge your students' feedback, reflect on how you can improve, and share how you will use their insights. We hope you will find this information helpful as you continue striving to improve your school's teaching and leadership practices.

Use this guide to reflect on your school's results and develop a strategy to help improve your school's instructional culture.

STEP 1: GET ORIENTED TO YOUR DATA

Explore the student survey data for a snapshot of how students are experiencing your school's instructional culture.

Consider your current school improvement priorities and initiatives	What are your top three priorities or initiatives? What parts of the data are you most excited to explore?
Review the <i>Focus Areas</i> tab	What rings true? What's surprising?
Review the chart at the top of the <i>Trends over Time</i> tab	How have your students' perspectives changed on the domains and items you've prioritized in the past? Do any changes surprise you?

STEP 2: PRIORITIZE A FOCUS AREA

Review the survey data in more detail to determine what to prioritize for improvement.

Choose a domain or two to prioritize for improvement	Consider trends over time and domains that support your existing priorities. Why did you choose this focus area?
Review the items in your priority domain(s) to help you understand student perceptions that contribute to your domain score	Which items stand out as areas of focus?



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STEP 3: COMMIT TO NEXT STEPS

Adjust your practices and support structures for students.

How do you want your priority focus area(s) to look or feel different? What are you working toward?

What actions do you commit to starting, improving, or discontinuing? Outline 2-3 concrete commitments with timeframes.

What resources or additional information do you need from your school leadership team, school staff and teachers?

STEP 4: SHARING RESULTS

Engage teachers and students with survey results and next steps.

What data points will you highlight as areas for celebration and areas for improvement?

What data would you like to discuss to learn more about how students are experiencing school culture?

What messages do you want to convey to your teachers and students about how your school leadership team is processing the results and what you'll do in response?

How will you share the student survey results or the message these results convey?
