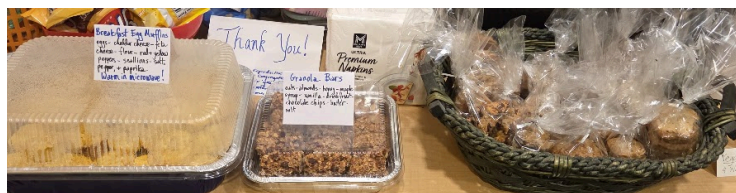
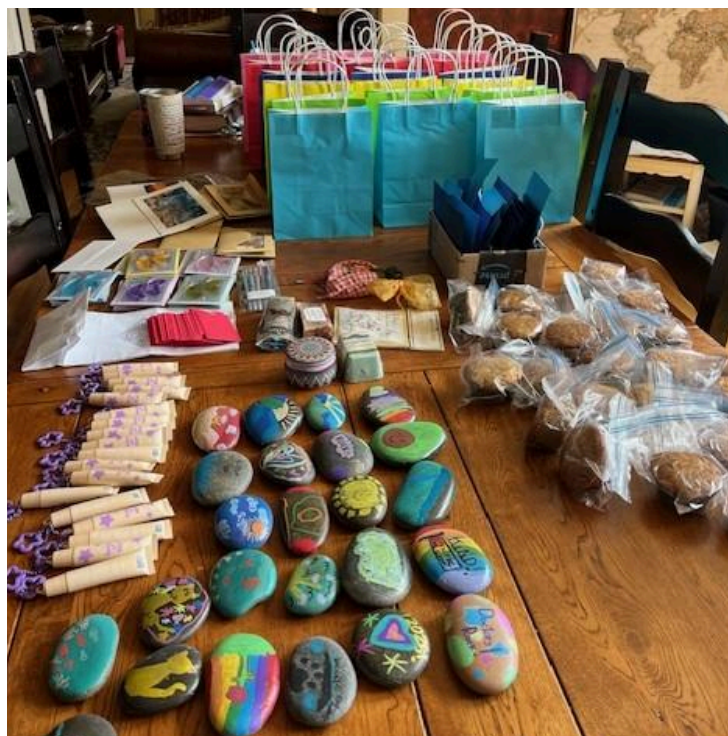
Upcoming Events

- **Planned Parenthood (PP) Patient Greeting:** Greeters serve as the first point of contact for patients to the Asheville health center. Working in groups, they facilitate patients reaching the front doors without harassment from protestors. Volunteers are asked to sign up for one two-hour shift per month (Friday or Saturday mornings). If interested, you can [access the application here](#).
- **AVL Period Pantry:** A grass-roots organization in Asheville has set up 11 indoor and 10 outdoor locations that offer 24/7 access to free period products (e.g., tampons, liners, pads, menstrual cups). 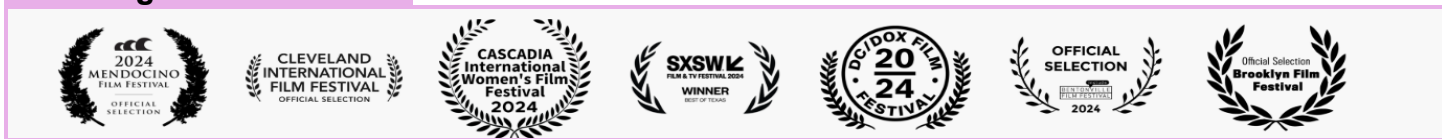


What Have We Been Doing?

In collaboration with our partners at Congregation Beth HaTephila (43 N. Liberty St.), we showed this award-winning documentary to over 50 attendees in June (2025). The film tells the story of “Crisis Pregnancy Centers” (CPCs) in the United States, anti-abortion organizations that counsel pregnant individuals against abortion and provide misleading information about reproductive health care. Defusing Antisemitism

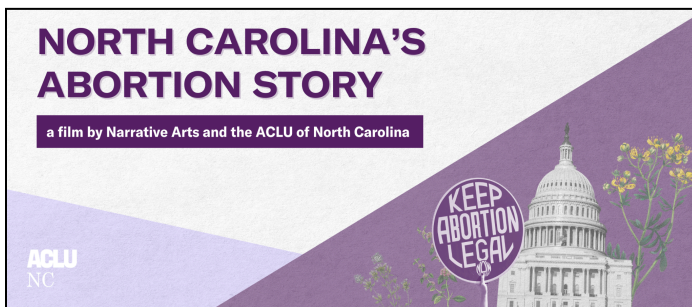

health physician with Planned Parenthood. The event was co-sponsored with our partner, Congregation Beth HaTephila.

Advocacy!

Following the U.S. Supreme Court's overturning of Roe v. Wade in 2022, RJM team member Susan Foster wrote a resolution on reproductive justice for the [national CUUPS organization](#): "We...support the right of any pregnant person to make decisions regarding their own reproductive health...The stripping of such rights violates the principles of the UUA, especially the inherent worth and dignity of every person; justice, equity, and compassion in human relations; and the right of conscience and the use of the democratic process..."
