Generally, it's recommended that you have these rugs professionally cleaned every two years, if possible. However, if you want to deep clean them yourself between professional treatments, then renting out steam cleaners would be the way to go.

This would remove dirt without damaging the material itself; just remember not to overuse this tool as the extra heat could affect your rug's quality.

After steam cleaning your entire rug or spot-treating smaller sections, you should then blot dry any excess moisture before airing it outside or inside (depending on weather conditions). It's also important to note that you should never place wool rugs or any type of rug directly in front of vents since this area could also give off extra heat.

Finally, beat down your newly washed carpets using a wooden or plastic-headed rug beater. Do this once they have completely dried flat against the floor for optimal results.

How to wash a wool rug

Vacuuming the rug
