

In Texas, a Notary Public has the authority to: Take acknowledgments; administer oaths or affirmations; protest instruments; take depositions; and certify copies of non-recordable documents.

A Notary does not guarantee the truth or accuracy of the document. The Notary has no obligation to verify the content of the document. And, the Notary does not legalize or validate a document.

OATHS, AFFIRMATIONS, AND JURATS

Oaths and jurats are for signer's to swear or affirm that the contents of a document are true. Depending on the jurisdiction, it also can be known as an affidavit or a verification on oath or affirmation.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

Acknowledgements are designed to ensure that the signer of a document is who they claim to be and has voluntarily signed the document.

SAFE DEPOSIT BOX OPENINGS

(Texas Finance Code 59.107, 59.108, and 59.109)

A notary public in the State of Texas may work with a bank or other financial institution to certify the contents of a safe deposit box on their premises. We can assist with properly listing and certifying the contents of any safe deposit box.

COPY CERTIFICATIONS

A notary public is able to certify copies of non-recordable documents in the State of Texas that are not available through any other public venue, such as an Bureau of Vital Statistics (i.e. a birth certificate).
