Townball FAQs

1. *What is twenty-first century townball?*

Twenty-first century townball is a bat-and-ball game based on the version of baseball played in Massachusetts before the civil war.

2. *Is townball vintage base ball?*

Yes, townball is vintage base ball. However, instead of playing a modern game with old rules, we play an old game with modern rules. We took the original rules of The Massachusetts Game and projected them to what we believe the game would have become had the Massachusetts style of play won out over that of New York as the American Pastime.

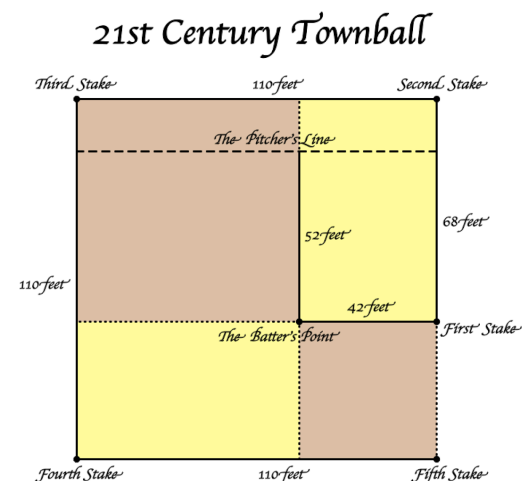
3. *How does the game end?*

In townball, the team that either scores thirteen runs first, or that is up by five after having scored at least eight runs, wins. This means that half of all townball games end in a walk-off run.
