On Friday, Nov. 11, 2016 Talawanda High School held a Veterans Day Breakfast and assembly to honor the brave Americans who have served in our nation's armed forces. Talawanda's FCCLA, headed by teacher Sharon Gregory, sponsored the event that included a contest for area students. Breakfast was served to our veterans in the THS cafeteria at 8 a.m. and the THS steel band, directed by Mike Marston, provided the musical entertainment. FCCLA contest chair Braelynn Wagers recognized area students who won the contest. At approximately 9 a.m. THS students and faculty joined the veterans in our gymnasium for an assembly that included the Butler County Sheriff's Office conducting the Presentation of Colors:



In addition, THS's Fermata Nowhere sang the National Anthem to an absolutely silent crowd. THS principal Tom York told the audience that he's served in public education for many years, but his single regret is never serving his country in the armed forces.
